NOTIFICATION

No. S.R.O./12-L/84/MF/IRD-11/31/80(Original).—In pursuance of the Proclamation of the 24th March, 1982, and in exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf, the President is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

THE JUDICIAL AND ACCOUNTANT MEMBERS (TAXES APPELLATE TRIBUNAL) RECRUITMENT RULES, 1984.

- 1. Short title.—These rules may be called the Judicial and Accountant Members (Taxes Appellate Tribunal) Recruitment Rules, 1984.
- 2. Definitions.—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—
 - (a) "appointing authority" means the Government and includes any officer authorised by the Government to make appointment to a post;
 - (b) "Commission" means the Bangladesh Public Service Commission;
 (c) "post" means the post of a Judicial Member or, as the case may be, Accountant Member of the Taxes Appellate Tribunal;
 - (d) "probationer" means a person appointed on probation to a post;
 - (e) "requisite qualification" means the qualification specified in the Schedule; and
 - (f) "Schedule" means the Schedule annexed to these rules.
- 3. Procedure for recruitment.—(1) Subject to the provisions of the schedule, appointment to a post shall be made—
 - (a) by direct recruitment; or
 - (b) by transfer on deputation.

- (2) No person shall be appointed to a post unless he has the requisite qualification and, in the case of direct recruitment he is also within the age limit specified in the schedule.
- 4. Appointment by direct recruitment.—(1) No appointment to a post by direct recruitment shall be made except upon the recommendation of the commission.
- (2) No person shall be eligible for appointment to a post by direct recruitment, if he—
 - (a) is not a citizen of Bangladesh; or
 - (b) is married to, or has entered into a promise of marriage with, a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.
 - (3) No appointment to a post by direct recruitment shall be made until-
 - (a) the person selected for appointment is certified by a Medical Board set up for the purpose by the Director-General of Health Services to be medically fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer from any such organic defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the post; and
 - (b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment in the service of the Republic.
 - (4) No person shall be recommended for appointment to a post unless-
 - (a) he applied in such form, accompanied by such fee and before such date as was notified by the Commission while inviting applications for the post; and
 - (b) in the case of a person already in Government service or in the service of a local authority, he applied through his official superior.
- 5. Appointment by transfer on deputation.—The appointing authority may make appointment to a post by transfer on deputation of a person who is in the service of the Republic and who possesses the requisite qualification.
- 6. Probation.—(1) Persons selected for appointment to a post, otherwise than by transfer on deputation, against a substantive vacancy shall be appointed on probation for a period of two years from the date of substantive appointment.
- (2) Where, during the period of probation of a probationer, the appointing authority is of opinion that his conduct and work is unsatisfactory or that he is not likely to become efficient, it may before the expiry of that period terminate his service.
- (3) After the completion of the period of probation, the appointing authority,—
 - (a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during his period of probation has been satisfactory, shall confirm him; and
 - (b) if it is of opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during that period was not satisfactory, may terminate his service.
- Repeal.—The Income-Tax Appellate Tribunal (Appointment of Members) Rules, 1968, are hereby repealed.
