No. S.R.O. 22-L/78/S-V/1R-1/78/79.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 133 of the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh the President, after consultation with the Public Service Commission as required by clause (2) of article 140 of that Constitution, is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

THE FIELD WORKER (POPULATION PLANNING UNIT, DIRECTORATE OF LABOUR) RECRUITMENT RULES, 1977.

1. **Short title.**—These rules may be called the Field Worker (Population Planning Unit, Directorate of Labour) Recruitment Rules, 1977.

2. **Definitions.**—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—

- (a) "appointing authority" means the Government and includes any officer authorised by the Government to make appointment to the post;
- (b) "Commission" means the Public Service Commission;
- (c) "Post" means the post of Field worker of the Population Planning Unit, Directorate of Labour;
- (d) "recognised University" means a University established by or under any law for the time being in force and includes any other University declared by Government, after consultation with the Commission to be a recognised University for the purpose of these rules;
- (e) "requisite qualification" means the qualification specified in column 3 of the Schedule; and
- (f) "Schedule" means the Schedule to these rules.

3. **Procedure of recruitment.**—(1) Subject to the provisions of the Schedule, appointment to the post shall be made by direct recruitment.

(2) No person shall be appointed to the post unless he has the requisite qualification and is also within the age limit laid down in the Schedule.

4. **Appointment.**—(1) No appointment to the post shall be made by the appointing authority except upon the recommendation of the Commission.

(2) No person shall be eligible for appointment to the post if he—

- (a) is not a citizen of Bangladesh, or a permanent resident of, or domiciled in, Bangladesh;
- (b) is married to, or has entered into a promise of marriage with a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.

(3) No appointment to the post shall be made until—

- (a) the person selected for appointment is certified by a Medical Board set up for the purpose by the Government to be medically fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer from any such organic defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the post ;
- (b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment in the service of the Republic.

In the aforesaid Rules, in rule 16, after sub-rule (5) the following new sub-rule (5A) shall be inserted, namely:—

“(5A) When an allottee leaves Bangladesh to join in service with a foreign Government or organisation maintaining lien or right of reversion with the Government, such allottee may be allowed to retain the Government accommodation for a period of two months from the date of his release”.
