Dacca, the 9th March 1978.

No. S.R.O. 49-L/78 MV/IR-7/77(Pt.).—The following draft of certain further amendments to the Motor Vehicles Rules, 1940, which it is proposed to make, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 70 of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1939 (IV of 1939), is hereby published as required by sub-section (1) of section 133 of the said Act for the information of all persons likely to be affected thereby and notice is hereby given that the draft will be taken into consideration on or after 23rd March 1978.

Any objection or suggestion which may be received from any person with respect to the said draft before the date specified will be considered by the Government.

Draft Amendments

In the aforesaid Rules,—

- (1) in rule 129, in sub-rule (a), in clause (i), for the words "twenty seven feet and six inches" the words "thirty five feet" shall be substituted; and
- (2) in rule 131, in sub-rule (b), in the proviso, for the full-stop at the end a semi-colon shall be substituted and thereafter the following shall be added, namely:—

"Provided further that in case of rear overhang the percentage may be increased up to sixty-one per cent".
