NOTIFICATION

Dacca, the 18th February, 1977.

No. S.R.O. 57-L/77/MV/1A-5/76.—The following draft of certain amendment to the Motor Vehicles Tax Rules, 1966, which it is proposed to make in exercise of the powers conferred by section 12 of the Motor Vehicles Tax Act, 1932 (Bengal Act I of 1932), is hereby published as required by subsection (1) of the said section, for the information of all persons likely to be affected thereby and notice is hereby given that the draft will be taken into consideration on or after 25th February 1977.

Any objection or suggestion which may be received from any person with respect to the said draft before the date specified will be considered by the Government.

Draft Amendment

In the aforesaid Rules,—

(a) for rule 3 the following shall be substituted, namely:—

“3. **Method of paying tax.**—The tax shall be paid to the Taxing Officer of the area in which the vehicle is kept. Payment shall be made through postal adhesive stamp or in such other manner as the Taxing Officer may allow.”;

(b) in rule 8,—

(i) in sub-rule (1), the words and commas “or retain, as a voucher, one copy of the Treasury challan, as the case may be” shall be omitted; and

(ii) in sub-rule (2), clause (a) shall be omitted;

(c) in rule 28, in sub-section (1), for clause (b) the following shall be substituted, namely:—

“(b) postal adhesive stamps;” and

(d) in the Schedule, in Form G, the column under heading “Challan number” shall be omitted.

SUMMARY MARTIAL LAW COURT, NILPHAMARY,
RNAGPUR.

PROCLAMATIONS

M. L. Case No. G. R. 116/69.

Whereas it appears to me that the accused persons named below are wanted in connection with Martial Law Case No. G. R. 116/69 arising out of Gaibandha P. S. case No. 9, u/s. 409/109, B. P. C., dated 26th February, 1969 under M. L. R. for trial ;

And whereas this court has reason to believe that the accused persons named below are absconding or concealing themselves to avoid appearance or arrest for the purpose ;

Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by Martial Law Regulation 3(7) of M. L. R. 1975, I, Shah Muhammed Ershaduzzaman, Member, Summary Martial Law Court, Nilphamari, direct the accused persons named below to appear before my court at Nilphamari, within 7 days from the date of publication of this order in the official Gazette. If they fail to appear on or before the date fixed (*i.e.*, 15th March, 1977), they will be tried *in absentia* and their properties will be forfeited to the Government.
