প্রস, জার, ও নং ৭৩-জাইন/৯৫—Bangladesh Merchant Shipping Ordinance, 1983 (XXVI of 1983) এর section 95 এবং 506 এ প্রদত্ত ক্ষমতাবলে সরকার Bangladesh Merchant Shipping (Certification of Deck Officers) Rules, 1991-এর নিশ্নর প্রথাকতর সংশোধন করিল, বথাঃ—

উপরি-উত্ত Rules এর (১) rule 2 এর-

- (ক) clause (a) এর বিধান clause (aa) রূপে প্নঃসংখ্যায়িত হইবে এবং প্নঃ সংখ্যায়িত clause এর পূর্বে নিদ্নরূপ নৃতন clause (a) সন্নিরেশিত হইবেঃ— "(a) "approved" means approved by the Department of Shipping;";
- (খ) clause (e) এর পরিবতে নিন্দার প clause (e) প্রতিস্থাপিত হইবে, যথাঃ-
 - "(e) "Examiner" means a person appointed as Nautical Surveyor and Examiner by the Government or any other person whose services may be employed by the Government for conducting examination of deck officers under these Rules;";
- (২) rule 3(1) এ বিধৃত টেবিলের প্রথম কলামে "Coastal Master" শৃক্স্বিলির পর "Class 5" শব্দ ও সংখ্যা সংযোজিত হইবে;

- (৩) rule 5 এর sub-rule (2) এর পরিবর্তে নিন্দর্প sub-rule (2) প্রতিন্থাপিত হইবে, যথাঃ—
 - "(2) An endorsement required under sub-rule (1) may be granted by the Chief Examiner on production of a certificate to the effect that the candidate has successfully attained an approved familiarisation and safety course for the required type of ship and that he has experience in a similar ship for not less than 3 months in the capacity of an independent watch-keeping officer.";

(৪) rule 12 এর পরিবর্তে নিন্দর প rule 12 প্রতিস্থাপিত হইবে:

"12. Remission of Sea-service:

- (1) Remission of sea-service in case of examination of Class 3, 4 and 5 Deck Officers shall be allowed as follows:
 - (a) pre-sea training in the Marine Academy, Chittagong, shall be counted for remission at one half of the sea-service required for the relevant examination subject to a maximum of nine months;
 - (b) attendance to an approved Preparatory Course for a Certificate of Competency Examination and to approved Ancillary Courses of at least ninety days duration shall entitle a Deck Cadet for a remission of thirty days;
 - (c) one fourth of the services given for pilotage of sea-going ships in the port of Chittagong or Mongla or any other approved port shall be counted for remission subject to a maximum of half of the total sea-service required for the relevant class of examination; this service can be applied for remission upto Deck Officer Class-3 Examination.
- (2) Remission allowed for one class of examination under subrule (1) shall not be allowed for an examination of a higher class.";
- (৫) rule 14 এর (ক) sub-rule এর পরিবর্তে নিন্দার্প sub-rule (1) প্রতিস্থাপিত ইইবে, বথাঃ—
 - "(1) Subject to sub-rule (2), a Provisional Certificate of Competency may be issued to a candidate only after he has passed all examinations and tests required under these Rules.";
 - (খ) sub-rule (4) এর পরিবর্তে নিম্নর প sub-rule (4) প্রতিস্থাপিত হইরে, যথা :--
 - "(4) If a candidate passes any of the written subjects, he shall not be required to appear at an examination for the same subject during the next three years from the date of publication of the result.";

(৬) rule 20 এর পরিবর্তে নিম্নার্প rule 20 প্রতিস্থাপিত হইবে, বথা:-

"20. Entry requirement of Cadets:

A person to be employed as cadet must be at least 18 years of age on the date of application and have passed Higher Secondary Certicate Examination or equivalent (at least in 2nd Division) with Physics and Mathematics. He must be of sound physical and mental health with perfect hearing and eye-sight. The candidate will be required to pass a new entrant sight test.";

REQUIREMENT FOR DECK OFFICERS

The requirements to be met for appearing at various classes of certificate of competency examinations or for being issued with such certificates are laid down below:

1. DECK OFFICER CLASS 5 (COASTAL MASTER):

(1) A candidate must have performed minimum 36 (thirty six) months' service onboard inland or coastal vessel after having obtained Inland Master Class 1 Certificate.

(2) ENDORSEMENT AS COASTAL MASTER:

- (a) A candidate shall be endorsed as a Coastal Master in his original Certificate of Competency subject to the fulfillment of the following requirements:—
 - (i) the candidate must be in possession of a valid Certificate of Competency as First Class Master issued under Inland Shipping Ordinance, 1976 (LXXII of 1976) and must have served in a coastal vessel as incharge of deck department for a minimum period of four years;
 - (ii) he must pass an oral examination to be conducted by the Chief Examiner.
- (b) The endorsement as Coastal Master granted under this sub-para shall be treated as equivalent to Certificate of Competency as Coastal Master Class 5.

(c) The provisions of this para for assessment of eligibility shall be applicable to candidates performing service as above on or before 31st December, 1996 and, subject to satisfactory eligibility and requirement. However, these candidates shall be allowed to appear at the examination of the respective grade even after 1996.

2. DECK OFFICER CLASS 4:

- (1) A candidate must produce the evidence of-
 - (a) sea-service performed as Deck Rating on an ordinary trading ship for not less than 60 (sixty) months, at least 24 (twenty four) months of which must be as Able (AB) Seaman, provided the candidate had passed Higher Secondary Certificate Examination or equivalent (at least in 2nd Division) with Physics and Mathematics before making application for the examination; or
 - (b) service performed in the Seaman Branch of the Navy for not less than 84 (eighty four) months, provided the candidate had passed Higher Secondary Certificate Examination or equivalent (at least in 2nd Division) with Physics and Mathematics befor making application for the examination; or
- (c) service performed in a vessel on coastal trade for at least 36 (thirty six) months after having obtained Deck Officer Class-5 Certificate of Competency (Coastal Master), provided the candidate had passed
- Higher Secondary Certificate Examination or equivalent with Physics and Mathematics before making application for the examination; or
- (d) service performed as a Deck Cadet on trading ship for not less than 36 (thirty six) months; or
- (e) service performed on a fishing vessel for not less than 72 (seventy two) months, at least 24 (twenty four) months of which had been performed after having obtained Fishing Vessel (Deck Officer) Certificate of Competency Class 1 (Skipper).
- (2) A minimum of 6 (six) months sea-service on a trading ship shall be required for issuance of a certificate to those candidates who do not have to his credit any of the services specified in sub-para (1).

3. DECK OFFICER CLASS 3:

(1) A candidate must have served on trading ship for not less than 36 (thirty six) months as a Deck Cadet, of which at least six months must have been spent on duties associated with bridge watchkeeping.

- (2) A candidate who has served in the Navy shall be eligible to appear at the examination provided he fulfils the following conditions:—
 - (a) he has served for at least 84 (eighty four) months in the Navy;
 - (b) he has attained the rank of a Lieutenant in the Executive Branch of the Navy;
 - (c) he has passed H.S.C. Examination or equivalent (at least 2nd Division) with Physics and Mathematics and is in possession of a certificate of Naval Watchkeeping for at least 6 (six) months;
 - (d) he must have passed the examination in General Ship Knowledge (Class 4) and must have certificates relating to ancillary courses required for Deck Officer Class 4 Examination under rules 25; and
 - (e) a minimum of six months' sea service on a trading ship shall be required for issuance of the certificate to that candidate who did not have such experience.
- (3) A candidate may appear at Deck Officer Class 3 Written Examination or Deck Officer Class-4 Written Examination in any order he likes, and he can appear at these two examinations at the same time without repetition of subjects. If the candidate passes Deck Officer Class-3 Examination befor passing Deck Officer Class-4 Examinaton, the certificate for Deck Officer Class 3 Examination will not be issued to him until he obtains certificate for Deck Officer Class 4 Examination; but Result Sheet for the success will be issued to him.

4. DECK OFFICER CLASS 2:

- (1) A candidate must have served as Watchkeeping Officer for not less than 18 months on trading ship after obtaining Deck Officer Class 3 certificate.
- (2) A candidate who has served in the Navy is also eligible to appear at the examination, provided he fulfils the following conditions:—
 - (a) he has served in the Navy for at least 120 (one hundred twenty) months;
 - (b) he has attained the rank of Lt. Commander in the Executive Branch;
 - (c) he is in possession of a certificate of Naval Watchkeeping for at least six months;
 - (d) he has passed H. S. C. Examination or equivalent (at least 2nd Division) with Physics and Mathematics; and

(e) he must have certificates relating to Ancillary Courses required for Deck Officer Class-2 under rule 25.

5. DECK OFFICER CLASS 1 (MASTER MARINER):

- A candidate must have performed a total of 42 months watchkeeping service of which at least 18 months shall be after obtaining Deck Officer Class 2 Certificate.
- (2) Candidates who fulfil the requirements for the Class 2 (Deck Officer) Examination may take the written part of the Class 1 (Deck Officer) Certificate of Competency Examination immediately after taking the Class 2 examination. If successful, he would only be issued with the Result sheet for written part of the examination.

However, the Certificate of Competency shall be issued on completion of required watchkeeping service and passing of Oral examination for Class 1.

6. COMMAND ENDORSEMENT:

A candidate must have at least Deck Officer Class 3 Competency Certificate. This endorsement can be issued for "Coasting Ships" only."
