NOTIFICATION

Dhaka, the 11th March 1984

No. S.R.O. 89-L/84.—In pursuance of the Proclamation of the 24th March, 1982, and in exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf, the President after consultation with the Bangladesh Public Service Commission, is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

THE AIR CONDITIONING ENGINEER (NATIONAL BROADCASTING AUTHORITY) RECRUITMENT RULES, 1984

1. **Short title and application.**—(1) These rules may be called the Air-Conditioning Engineer (National Broadcasting Authority) Recruitment Rules, 1984.

(2) These rules shall apply to the Air-Conditioning Engineers of the Radio Bangladesh.

2. **Definitions.**—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—

(a) "appointing authority" means the Government and includes any officer authorised by the Government to make appointment to the specified post;

(b) "commission" means the Bangladesh Public Service Commission;

(c) "Probationer" means a person appointed on probation to the post against a substantive vacancy;

- (d) "requisite qualification" means the qualification laid down in the schedule;
- (e) "schedule" means the schedule annexed to these rules; and
- (f) "specified post" means the post specified in the schedule.

3. **Procedure for recruitment.**—(1) Subject to the provisions of the schedule, appointment to the specified post shall be made—

- (a) by promotion, or
- (b) by transfer on deputation.

(2) No person shall be appointed to the specified post unless he has the requisite qualification.

4. **Appointment by promotion.**—Appointment by promotion to the specified post shall be made on the recommendation of the Commission.

5. **Probation.**—(1) Persons selected for appointment by promotion to the specified post against a substantive vacancy shall be appointed on probation for a period of one year from the date of substantive appointment:

Provided that the appointing authority may, for reasons to be recorded in writing, extend the period of probation by a period or periods so that the extended period does not exceed two years in the aggregate.

(2) Where, during the period of probation, the appointing authority is of opinion that the conduct or work of a probationer is not satisfactory, or that he is not likely to become efficient, it may, before the expiry of that period revert him to the post from which he was promoted.

(3) After the completion of the period of probation including the extended period, if any, the appointing authority,—

- (a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during his period of probation has been satisfactory, shall, subject to the provisions of sub-rule (4), confirm him; and
- (b) if it is of opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during that period was not satisfactory, may revert him to the post from which he was promoted.

(4) A probationer shall not be confirmed in the specified post until he has passed such examination and undergone such training as the Government may, from time to time, direct.

SCHEDULE

Name of the specified post.	Method of recruitment.	Qualification and experience.
Air-Conditioning Engineer.	By promotion, or if no suitable candidate is available for promotion, by transfer on deputation of a Government Officer having requisite qualification and experience in other Government offices.	Diploma in air-conditioning with at least 5 years' service as Air-Conditioning Supervisor in the Radio Bangladesh on regular appointment.
