NOTIFICATION

Dhaka, the 12th March, 1984

No. SRO 103-L/84/MVRT/3M-69/83.—In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 84(2)(P) of the Motor Vehicles Ordinance, 1983 (LV of 1983), the Government is pleased to make the following further amendments in the Motor Vehicles Rules, 1940, the same having been previously published as required under sub-section (1) of Section 173 of the said Ordinance, namely:—

In the aforesaid Rules, —for rule 162A, the following shall be substituted, namely:—

“162A. **Painting of bodies of motor cab (taxi, auto-rickshaw and scooter).**—The body of every motor cab (taxi, auto-rickshaw and scooter) plying for hire or reward shall be painted with yellow colour on top and black colour on the rest of the body:

Provided that the auto-rickshaws owned by Auto-rickshaw Owners' Co-operatives shall have a 9 (nine) inches wide yellow line at the middle of the black body.”
