NOTIFICATION

Dacca, the 26th April 1977.

No. S. R. O. 133-L/329/D/Cus.—In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (c) of section 21 of the Customs Act, 1969 (IV of 1969), the National Board of Revenue is pleased to authorize repayment to the extent specified in column (3) of the Table below of Customs duties paid on the importation of the raw materials specified in column (1) of the said Table and used in the production or manufacture of the goods specified in column (2) thereof, subject to the following conditions, namely:

- (i) The goods have been manufactured according to the formula duly furnished to the National Board of Revenue showing the quantity of various imported raw materials specified in column (1) of the said Table and used in the production or manufacture of the goods specified in column (2) thereof.
 - (ii) The manufacturer maintains proper record of the goods manufactured in accordance with the formula referred to in sub-paragraph (i) and produces, on demand, such records and other evidence as may be required by the National Board of Revenue to satisfy itself that the imported raw materials have been used in accordance with the formula.
 - (iii) The manufactured goods are exported out of Bangladesh and an application for repayment of Customs duties is presented to the proper officer of Customs within 60 days of such exportation or of the publication of this notification, whichever is the later.
 - (iv) The exporter makes a declaration on the reverse of the original shipping bill or other export documents to the effect that he would claim repayment of the Custom duties paid on the imported raw materials used in the production of the goods being exported.
 - (v) The repayment at the rate specified shall be allowed provided that the goods exported are manufactured with the same constituents on which the rate of repayment is notified and the manufacturer-exporter shall immediately intimate to the National Board of Revenue and the Directorate of Inspection and Training (Customs and Excise), Dacca:—
 - (a) any change in the process of the imported raw materials,
 - (b) any change in the composition of the manufactured goods to be exported, and
 - (c) use of any indigenous raw materials in place of the imported raw materials.
2. The repayment authorized by this Notification shall be admissible in respect of the goods exported on or after the 22nd February 1973.

RECRUITMENT RULES FOR THE POSTS OF GAZETTED OFFICERS (ECONOMIC AND RESEARCH), 1977.

1. Short title and Commencement:—

- (i) These rules may be called the Gazetted Officers (Economic and Research) Recruitment Rules, 1977.
- (ii) They shall come into force at once.

2. Definitions.—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context—

- (a) "appointing authority" means the Government and includes, in relation to any specified post, any Officer authorised by the Government to make appointment to such post;
- (b) "Commission" means the Bangladesh Public Service (First) Commission.
- (c) "Recognised University" means a University established by or under any law for the time being in force and includes any other University declared by Government, after consultation with the Commission, to be a recognised University for the purpose of these rules;

- (d) "requisite Qualification" in relation to a specified post, means the qualifications laid down in the Schedule in relation to the post;
- (e) "Schedule" means a Schedule to these rules; and
- (f) "Specified post" means a post specified in the Schedule.

3. **Procedure of recruitment.**—(1) Subject to the provisions of the Schedule and such instructions relating to reservation for the purpose of clause (3) of article 29 of the Constitution, appointment to a specified post shall be made—

- (a) by direct recruitment; or
- (b) by promotion from amongst persons already holding a specified post; or
- (c) by transfer on deputation.

(2) No person shall be appointed to a specified post unless he has the requisite qualification, and in case of direct recruitment, he is also within the age limit laid down in the Schedule for the post:

Provided that the age limit is relaxable in case of a candidate from the Ministry of Finance:

Provided further that the experience of a candidate shall in such field as the Government may specify in this behalf.

(3) Notwithstanding anything contained in these rules, the Government may, in consideration of experience and merit and with the concurrence of the Commission, relax in any exceptional case to such extent and subject to such conditions, if any, as it may deem fit, any of the requirements of these rules.

(4) Notwithstanding anything contained in these Rules Government may fill up the sanctioned posts as on the date of coming into effect of this Rules, by the persons now serving in the Ministry of Finance or by direct recruitment in both cases in consultation with the Bangladesh Public Service (First) Commission.

4. **Appointment by direct recruitment.**—(1) No appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made except upon the recommendation of the Commission.

(2) No person shall be eligible for appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment if he—

- (a) is not a citizen of Bangladesh;
- (b) is married to, or has entered into a promise of marriage with, a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.

(3) No appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made until:

- (a) the person selected for appointment is certified by a Medical Board set up for the purpose by the Director of Health Services to be medically fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer from any such organic defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the specified posts; and
- (b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment in the service of the Republic.

(4) No person shall be recommended for appointment to a specified post unless—

- (a) he applied in such form, accompanied by such fee and before such date, as was notified by the Commission while inviting applications for the post; and
- (b) in the case of a person already in the service of the Republic or in the service of a local authority he has applied through his official superior.

5. **Appointment by promotion or transfer.**—(1) Appointment by promotion or by transfer shall be made—

- (a) in case of an Economic Adviser or a Deputy Economic Adviser, after considering the recommendations of such Departmental Promotion Board as the Government may set up for the purpose;
- (b) in case of other specified post, after considering the recommendations of such Promotion Committee as the Government may, in consultation with the Commission, set up for the purpose.

(2) A person shall not be eligible for appointment by promotion to a specified post if he has unsatisfactory service records.

6. **Probation.**—(1) Persons selected for appointment to a specified post against a substantive vacancy shall be appointed on probation :—

- (a) in the case of direct recruitment, for a period of two years from the date of substantive appointment; and
- (b) in the case of promotion, for a period of one year from the date of such appointment:

Provided that the appointing authority may, for reasons to be recorded in writing, of any person by a period or periods so that the extended period does not exceed two years in the aggregate.

(2) Soon after the completion of the period of probation including the extended period, if any, the appointing authority—

- (a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during his period of probation has been satisfactory, shall subject to the provision of sub-rule (3), confirm him; and
- (b) if it is of opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during that period was not satisfactory, may, in the case of the direct recruitment, terminate his service, and, in the case of promotion, revert him to the post from which he was promoted.

(3) A probationer shall not be confirmed in a specified post until he has passed such examinations as the Government may, from time to time, direct.

Concerned units may submit licence form accordingly.

2. The following amendments/corrections in the Import Policy (January—June, 1977) Order, are notified for the information of all concerned :—
