## BANGLADESH MINIMUM WAGES BOARD Printing Press Industry

#### RECOMMENDATIONS, 1975

The Bangladesh Minimum Wages Board, established under the Minimum Wages Ordinance, 1961 (Ordinance No. XXXIX of 1961) and constituted by the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh for Printing Press Industry for the review of the minimum rates of wages under notification No. S-VI/R-16/72/736, dated the 13th December 1973, was directed to recommend, after such inquiry as the Board thinks fit, the minimum rates of wages for the workers employed in the aforesaid Industry in Bangladesh.

The Board visited a considerable number of Printing Presses in Bangladesh and observed the working conditions of different categories of workers, wages registers and mode of payment of the employers and other factors including the economic conditions and cost of living of the workers in general and particularly those employed in the aforesaid Industry.

The Board having completed its inquiries after eliciting information from the employers and the workers published its proposed recommendations under rule 15 of the Minimum Wages Rules, 1961, giving an opportunity to persons likely to be affected thereby to file objections or make suggestions in writing with supporting data.

The Board after very careful considerations of the objections and suggestions submitted under rule 15 of the Minimum Wages Rules, 1961 and the existing minimum rates of wages prevailing in other Industries, and the general cost of living, do hereby recommend to the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh under section 5 of the Minimum Wages Ordinance, 1961, as follows:

- (1) Nomenclature of all the known occupations or work in the Printing Press Industry be standardised and classified into three groups as in Schedule A hereto attached, in consideration of the nature or degree of training, knowledge, experience, skill, efficiency, responsibility, physical hardships, occupational hazards, etc., required for, or involved in, the performance of work in each occupation.
- (2) Employers in the Industry shall forthwith assign the standardised designations, as in Schedule A, to the workers in their appropriate occupations adapt the same in the wage registers and issue correct wage slips to the workers, where necessary. If, for any reason, any occupation in the Industry has been left out and not classified in Schedule A, the employers shall appropriately classify the same and put it under relevant individual occupation under the appropriate group and pay the minimum rate of wage for that occupation at a rate not below the minimum fixed for relevant group as shown in Schedule B hereto attached. They shall forthwith report the same to the Chairman of the Board for amendment of the Schedule.
- (3) If, in the Industry, any worker/workers is/are employed and paid through contractors, such contract-labour shall be treated as workers within the meaning of sub-section (9) of section 2 of the "Minimum Wages Ordinance, 1961 (Ordinance No. XXXIX of 1961) and the "employers" (including the contractor) shall comply with the provisions of recommendation No. 2 above.

- (4) If the employer in the Industry has piece-rated workers, he shall revise the rates of remunerations for such workers in the different groups as shown in Schedule A, in such manner as will ensure the minimum wages fixed for each group as in Schedule B.
- (5) The employers shall pay to the workers engaged in occupations classified in Schedule A, at rates not less than those fixed for each group as mentioned in Schedule B.
- (6) The minimum rates of wages fixed in Schedule B shall not be regarded as maximum rates and any existing wages higher than the minimum now fixed shall not be reduced. The employers shall, however, be free to pay higher wages either unilaterally on their initiative or by collective agreement in view of any considerations including higher grade of experience or higher cost of living in a particular locality or other reasons.
- (7) The minimum rates of wages fixed in Schedule B shall come into operation with effect from the 1st of March, 1975.

Act VII of 1965), the Government is pleased to suspend the operation of the provisions of sections 4, 8, 10 and 11 of the said Act in respect of the workers of Mobarakgonj Chinikal, Jessore, for the period from the 1st day of October, 1974, to the 30th day of April, 1975 subject to the following conditions, namely:—
  - (1) The workers working overtime shall be paid wages at double the rate of ordinary wages for working beyond the normal working hours.
  - (2) The workers deprived of weekly holidays admissible under the Act shall be allowed Compensatory weekly holidays within a month after the 30th day of April, 1975.
