NOTIFICATION

Dhaka, the 1st April, 1984

No. S.R.O. 134-L/84/116-Excise.—In exercise of the powers conferred under section 12A(1) of the Excises and Salt Act, 1944 (1 of 1944), the Government is pleased to exempt all classess of exciseable goods, produced or manufactured within such areas as may be earmarked by the Government as the special Economic Zone of Chittagong Hill tracts, from the payment of the whole of excise duty leviable thereon, subject to the following conditions, namely:—

- (i) the facility shall be available only to the industrial undertakings involving investment not exceeding two lacs taka,
- (ii) such industrial enterprises shall submit details of investments to the Collector of Customs and Excise, Chittagong duly supported by certificates from the sponsoring authority,
- (iii) the units shall submit half-yearly return to the Collector mentioned above showing productions and quantity of clearance and value thereof, and
- (iv) the units shall be bound to pay excise duty and observe all other excise formalities as required under the Excises and Salt Act, 1944 (1 of 1944), or the rules made thereunder in the event of any subsequent investment in the same enterprise, resulting investment exceeding two lacs taka.
