### NOTIFICATION

# Dacca, the 11th May, 1982

No. S.R.O. 142-L/82/ED/Recruitment/1-15/80.—In pursuance of the Promation of the 24th March, 1982 and in exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf, the Chief Martial Law Administrator is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

- Short title.—These rules may be called the Bangladesh Civil Service (Age, Qualification and Examination for Direct Recruitment) Rules, 1982.
- Application.—These rules shall apply to a Service or to a cadre post in a Service specified in Schedule I.
- Definition.—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—
  - (a) "backward section of citizens" for the purpose of these rules, means such citizens or class of citizens as the Government may, by notification in the official Gazette, declare to be backward section of citizens,
  - (b) "candidate" means a candidate for an examination;
  - (c) "Commission" means the Bangladesh Public Service Commission;

- (d) "cadre post" means a post specified in Schedule I;
- (e) "Compulsory subject" means the subjects specified in PART 'A' of Schedule II;
- (f) "degree" means a degree from a recognised University;
- (g) "examination" means an examination to be held for the purpose of recruitment to a Service or to a cadre post in a Service;
- (h) "Optional subject" means the optional subjects specified in PART 'B' of Schedule II;
- (i) "requisite qualification" in relation to a cadre post means the qualification laid down in Schedule I;
- (j) "recognised University" means a University established by or under any law for the time being in force and includes any other University declared by Government, after consultation with the Commission to be a recognised University for the purpose of these rules;
- (k) "Service" means a Service specified in Schedule I of the Bangladesh Civil Service Recruitment Rules, 1981; and
- (1) "Schedule" means a Schedule annexed to these rules.
- 4. Place of examination.—The examination shall be conducted by the Commission and shall be held at Dacca, Chittagong, Rajshahi and Khulna:

Provided that if, in the opinion of the Commission, the number of candidates at any other place or places justifies the holding of the examination there, the examination may also be held simultaneously at any other place or places.

- 5. Particulars to be announced by the Commission.—The following particulars relating to an examination shall be announced by the Commission, namely:—
  - (a) the date, time-table and place of the examination;
  - (b) name of the Service or name of the cadre post in a service to be filled in on the basis of examination; and
  - (c) such other particulars as the Commission may consider necessary.
- 6. Eligibility, etc.—(1) Persons of either sex shall be eligible for admission to an examination under these rules.
- (2) Persons in the service of the Republic or in the service of a local authority, who are eligible for an examination, shall be admitted if they are permitted to take the examination by their respective appointing authority.
- (3) A person who resigned or was removed from the service of the Republic or of a local authority and is eligible for admission to an examination under these rules shall submit with his/her application for admission to such examination an attested copy of the letter of acceptance of his/her resignation or order of removal.

- Decision as to eligibility.—(1) The decision of the Commission as to the eligibility or otherwise of a candidate for admission to an examination shall be final.
- (2) A person admitted to an examination shall appear at the examination at the place specified in the Admit Card issued by the Commission under rule 10 at his own expense.
- 8. Submission of application, examination fees, etc.—(1) An application for admission to an examination shall be submitted to the Secretary of the Commission on or before such date as the Commission may announce in this behalf and no application shall be entertained by the Commission after the expiry of the date so announced.
- (2) A candidate shall specify in his/her application for admission the name of the Service/Services he/she wants to be considered for in order of preference, if any, if he/she intends to appear at the examination for any of the following Services:—
  - (i) Bangladesh Civil Service (Administrative : Administrative).
  - (ii) Bangladesh Civil Service (Administrative : Food).
  - (iii) Bangladesh Civil Service (Agriculture : Forest).
  - (iv) Bangladesh Civil Service (Agriculture : Livestock).
  - (v) Bangladesh Civil Service (Economic and Trade : Economic).
  - (vi) Bangladesh Civil Service (Economic and Trade : Statistical).
  - (vii) Bangladesh Civil Service (Finance: Audit and Accounts).
  - (viii) Bangladesh Civil Service (Finance: Customs and Excise).
    - (ix) Bangladesh Civil Service (Finance: Taxation).
    - (x) Bangladesh Civil Service (Foreign Affairs).
    - (xi) Bangladesh Civil Service (Health and Family Planning).
    - (xii) Bangladesh Civil Service (Information).
  - (xiii) Bangladesh Civil Service (Judicial).
  - (xiv) Bangladesh Civil Service (Postal).
  - (xv) Bangladesh Civil Service (Enforcement : Police).
  - (xvi) Bangladesh Civil Service (Enforcement : Ansar).
  - (xvii) Bangladesh Civil Service (Railway: Transportation and Commercial).
  - (xviii) Bangladesh Civil Service (Secretariat).
  - (3) A candidate shall specify in his/her application for admission the name of the cadre post he/she wants to be considered for, if he/she intends to appear at the examination for any cadre post in the following Services:—
    - (i) Bangladesh Civil Service (Agriculture : Agriculture).
    - (ii) Bangladesh Civil Service (Agriculture : Fisheries).
    - (iii) Bangladesh Civil Service (Engineering : Public Works).
    - (iv) Bangladesh Civil Service (Engineering : Public Health).
    - (v) Bangladesh Civil Service (Engineering: Roads and Highways).
    - (vi) Bangladesh Civil Service (Engineering: Tele-Communication)).
    - (vii) Bangladesh Civil Service (Railway: Engineering).

- . (viii) Bangladesh Civil Service (Economic and Trade : Trade).
  - (ix) Bangladesh Civil Service (Education : General Education).
  - (x) Bangladesh Civil Service (Education: Technical Education).
- (4) An application for admission to the examination shall be accompanied by a non-refundable fee of Taka 100 (Taka one hundred) only in the form of a receipted challan from a Government Treasury or the Bangladeh Bank. The fee shall be deposited under the head "XXXVI—Miscellaneous Examination fee":

Provided that in the case of a candidate belonging to any backward section of citizen, the non-refundable fee shall be Taka 50 (Taka fifty) only.

- (5) Three copies of passport size photograph of the candidate, taken not more than three months prior to the date of his/her application, shall be submitted with the application and each such copy shall be signed by the candidate on its back and his/her signature shall be duly attested by a Gazetted Officer.
- (6) An application which is incomplete or wrongly filled in or is not accompanied by the required information and documents shall be rejected.
- 9. Address.—Every candidate shall give his/her mailing address in the application form and shall intimate to the Secretary of the Commission of any change thereto.
- 10. Admit Card.—(1) The Commission shall issue an Admit Card to a candidate eligible for admission to an examination specifying therein the roll number and place of examination.
- (2) No candidate shall be admitted to an examination unless he/she holds an Admit Card issued by the Commission for the purpose.
- 11. Secrecy of answer-scripts.—All answer-scripts of the examination shall be treated as secret documents and shall not be shown to any candidate or his/her representative; and no application shall be entertained for re-examination of any answer-scripts.
- 12. Educational qualification.—(1) No person shall be allowed for admission to an examination unless he/she has the requisite qualification for the service or the cadre post in a Service he/she has applied for.
- (2) A candidate who has appeared at an examination of a recognised University, the passing of which shall render him/her eligible for appearing at the examination, may apply for admission to the examination and such application may be accepted provisionally. The candidate shall, however, be required to furnish, as soon as possible and in any case before the date fixed for his/her viva voce test, the original or provisional certificate showing that he has the requisite qualifications from the University. A candidate who applies for admission to an examination under this sub-rule shall submit along with his/her application an attested copy of his/her Admit Card or any other proof of having appeared at the said examination.

13. Age limit.—(1) Subject to the provisions of succeeding sub-rules, no person shall be eligible to appear at the examination if he/she is less than 21 years of age or has exceeded 25 years of age on the first day of the month in which the Commission invites applications for holding the examination:

Provided that for the first examination after the commencement of these rules, the maximum age shall be twenty-eight years instead of twenty-five years:

Provided further that the maximum age limit specified in sub-rule (1) shall be relaxable as under-

- (a) in the case of a person who is a member of a backward section of citizens, by such period as the Government may, from time to time, specify by notification, in the official Gazette;
- (b) in the case of a person who is a freedom fighter, on proper certificate, by such period as the Government may, by order, specify from time to time; and
- (c) in the case of a female candidate, by such period as the Government may, by order, specify from time to time.
- (2) No person shall be eligible to appear at an examination for a post of Bangladesh Civil Service (Education : General Education), Bangladesh Civil Service (Education: Technical Education), Bangladesh Civil Service (Health and Family Planning) and Bangladesh Civil Service (Judicial), if he/she is less than 21 years of age or has exceeded 30 years of age on the first day of the month in which the Commission invites applications for holding examination:

Provided that for the first examination after the commencement of these rules, the maximum age shall be thirty-two years instead of thirty years.

- (3) The maximum age limit specified in sub-rules (1) and (2) may be relaxed by the Government, from time to time, in special circumstances.
- (4) The date of birth as recorded in the Secondary School Certificate or in any other Certificate issued by an authority recognised by the Commission shall be accepted as proof of age of a candidate.
- 14. Nationality,-(1) No person shall be eligible for admission to an examination unless he/she is a citizen of Bangladesh.
- (2) A candidate shall not be eligible for appearing at an examination if he/she is married to, or has without the previous permission of the Government, entered into a promise of marriage with a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.
- 15. Penalty for furnishing false particulars, etc.-If a candidate knowingly furnishes any particulars which are false or which he/she believes to be false or suppresses any material information or deliberately submits any forged certificate or tampers with any entry in any document relating to his/her age or educational qualification or misbehaves in the examination hall, he/she may be disqualified not only for the examination to which such particulars, information, certificate tampering or misbehaviour, as the case may be, relates but also for all or any subsequent examination and may be debarred from employment under the Government and be also criminally prosecuted.

- 16. Selection of candidate by the Commission.—The Commission shall select persons from amongst the successful candidates and recommend their names to the Government for appointment to a Service/a cadre post in a Service.
- 17. Subjects for examination.—The examination for the purpose of recruitment to a Service/a cadre post in a Service shall include subjects as specified in Schedule II.
- 18. Subjects and distribution of marks.—(1) The examination for recruitment to a Service/a cadre post in a Service, other than those specified against Sl. Nos. 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27 and 28 of Schedule I shall consist of the following:—

- 19. Restriction to offer subjects, etc.—(1) No candidate shall be allowed to offer subjects which would carry more than 400 marks from any of the groups mentioned in PART 'B' of schedule II and if there are two papers on any subject mentioned in any group, a candidate shall have to take both the papers on the subject.
- (2) Each written paper carrying 100 marks shall be of three hours duration.
- (3) The minimum standard of subjects of the examination shall be determined by the Commission.
- 20. Minimum pass marks.—(1) The minimum pass marks shall be 45% in aggregate in written examination; 40% in the Viva voce test, Psychological and Intelligence tests taken together:

Provided that, if necessary, the Commission may, with prior approval of the Government, lower or enhance the minimum aggregate pass marks.

- (2) A candidate securing less than 25% marks in any compulsory subject, optional subject or in any relevant subjects shall be deemed to have secured no marks in that subject.
- 21. Language to be used.—Unless the Commission otherwise directs, a candidate may opt for answering the questions of the written papers either in Bengali or in English.
- 22. Viva voce, Psychological and Intelligence tests.—(1) Candidates qualifying in the written examination shall, after the announcement of the result

of such examination, be required to appear in the Viva voce, Psychological and Intelligence tests.

- (2) Each candidate shall be interviewed by a Board to be constituted by the Commission in this behalf. The Board shall attach particular importance to the intelligence, alertness of mind, vigour, strength of character and potential qualities of leadership of the candidates. The Board shall take into consideration extracurricular activities, such as, sports, debates, hobbies, etc., of the candidates.
- (3) Candidates called for viva voce test shall be required to undergo psychological test designed to assess their intelligence, personal qualities and traits of character with special regard to their aptitude for the post.
- 23. Medical examination.—(1) Candidates qualifying in the written examination, viva voce, psychological and intelligence tests shall be required to appear before a Medical Board for physical examination.
- (2) The manner and procedure of medical examination shall be as provided in Schedule III.
- 24. Repeal.—The Superior Posts (Examination for Recruitment) Rules, 1976, is hereby repealed.

### SCHEDULE-III

- 1. No candidate shall be eligible for appointment to a cadre post unless he/she has been certified by a Medical Board to be medically fit for such appointment and that he/she does not suffer from any such organic defect as is likly to interfere with the duties of the cadre post for which he/she may be considered. Successful completion of the medical exmination does not, however, guarantee appointment to any cadre post.
- 2. The Medical Board shall be constituted by the Director-General, Health Services, hereinafter referred to as the Director-General, to examine the physical fitness of the candidates for appointment through the Bangladesh Civil Service Examination on the request of the Bangladesh Public Service Commission. The Director-General will determine the date, place and other requisites for the examination in consultation with the Commission and communicate it to the candidates. Efforts will be made to hold the medical examination during the period contemporaneous to the dates of the viva voce test.
- 3. The minimum number of Members of the Board shall be three but the maximum number of Members may not be more than five.
- 4. A candidate shall appear at the medical test on the date specified by the Director-General. Under exceptional circumstances, Government may allow the candidate to appear at the medical test at a later date in consultation with the Director-General.
- The Director-General shall submit the report of the Medical Board on each
  of the candidates to the Bangladesh Public Service Commission in the Form for
  Medical Examination Report enclosed to this schedule.
- 6. Candidates whose height is less than 5 feet will not be considered physically fit for apointment to any cadre post. Candidates whose weight is less than 110 lbs. should be considered temporarily unfit. In the case of female candidates,

this standard will be reduced to 4 feet 10 inches, provided the weight of such candidates is not less than 96 lbs.

7. In the matter of the correlation of age, height and chest girth, the Medical Board will apply the following Table as a guide in the examination of the candidates:

Height with shoes.	Chest measurement of full expiration	Range of expansion not less than

- 8. The candidates height will be measured as follows:

  He/she will remove his/her shoes and be placed against the standard with his/her feet together and the weight thrown on the heels and not on the toes or outer side of the feet. He/she will stand erect without rigidity and with the heels, calves buttock and shoulders touching the standard; the chin will be depressed to bring the vettec of the head level under the horizontal bar, and the height will be recorded in inches and parts of an inch to quarters.
- q. The candidates chest will be measured as follows:-
- He/she will be made to stand erect with his/her feet together, and to raise his/her arms over his/her head. The tape will be so adjusted round the chest that its upper edge touches the inferior angles of the shoulder blades behind, and lies in the same horizontal plane when the tape is taken round the chest. The arms will then be lowered to hang loosely by the side and care will be taken that the shoulders are not thrown upwards or backwards so as to displace the tape. The candidate will then be directed to take a deep inspiration several times and maximum expansion of the cest will be carefully noted and the minimum will then be recorded in inches, 33-35 34-36/1/2 etc. In recording the measurements, fractions of less than 1½ inch should not be noted.
- 10. The candidate will be weighed and his/her weight be recorded in pounds, fractions of pound should not be noted.
  - 11. The candidate's eye sight will be tested as follows:
  - (i) General—The candidate's eyes will be submitted to a general examination directed to the detection of any disease or abnormality. The candidate will be rejected if he/she suffers from any squint or morbid condition of eyes, cyclids or contigeous structures or such as sort as to render or to be likely at a future date to render him/her unfit for service
  - (ii) Visual Acuity—A. The examination for determining the acuteness of vision includes two tests, one for distant, the other for near vision. Each eye will be examined separately.

B. No candidate will be considered fit for the service whose visual acuity falls below the following standards:

- (iii) Colour perception night blindness and field of vision:
  - (a) Each eye will be examined separately and the lids must be kept wide open during the test.
  - (b) Inability to distinguish the principal colour will not be regarded as a cause for rejection, but the fact will be noted in the proceedings and the candidates will be informed.
  - (c) Each eye must have a full field of vision as tested by hand movements.
- (iv) The degree of acuteness of vision of all candidates for appintment will be entered in the proceedings in the manner.

V.P. With glasses Reads ▼.L. With glasses Reads

- (v) In case of serious abnormality, the opinion of an ophthalmic specialist should be obtained.
- Note—No candidate will be accepted for appointment if his/her vision does not come up to the requirements specified above without the use of contact glass. (A contact glass or lens is defined as a glass shall, the concavity of which is in contact with the glove of the eye, a layer of liquid being interposed between the lens and the cornea. The meaning of the word "glass" wherever used above is to be interpreted as not covering contact glass).
- 12. The urine passed in the presence of the examiner should be examined and result recorded.
  - 13. The following additional points should be observed:
    - (i) that the candidate's hearing in each ear is good and that there is no sign of disease of the ear;
    - (ii) that the candidate's speech is without impediment;
    - (iii) that the candidate's teeth are in good order and that he/she is provided with dentures where necessary for effective mastication. Two of these teeth in each jaw must be molars. Well-filled teeth will be considered as sound;
    - (iv) that the candidate's chest is well formed and his/her chest expansion sufficient; and that his/her heart and lungs are sound;
    - (v) that there is no evidence of any abdominal disease;
    - (vi) that the candidate is not rap-turned;
  - (vii) that the candidate does not suffer from hydrocele; a server degree of variocele variose veins or piles;
  - (viii) that the candidate's limbs, hands and feet are well formed and developed and that there is free and perfect motion of all his joints;

- (ix) that the candidate does not suffer from any inveterate skin disease;
- (x) that there is no congenital malformation or defect;
- (xi) that the candidate does no bear traces of acute or chronic disease pointing to an impaired constitution;
- (xii) that the candidate bears marks of efficient vaccination;
  - In support of this the candidate will be required to produce certificate signed by Medical Officer, and that the candidate is free from communicable disease.
- 14. When any defect is found, it must be noted in the report and the medical examiner should state his opinion whether or not it is likely to interfere with the efficient performance of the duties which will be required of the candidate. It should be stated whether the condition is remediable by operation.
- 15. If a candidate is declared unfit by the Medical Board, he/she will be informed that he/she has been declared unfit. The candidate will also be informed of the particular defect or defects for which he/she has been declared unfit. The candidate may prefer an appeal aganist the decision of the Medical Board to the Bangladesh Public Service Commission within 14 days of receipt of the information.
- 16. Government, however, reserves the right to deal with the appeal in such manner as it may deem fit and do not bind itself to constitute an Appeallate Medical Board for the examination of the candidate concerned.
- 17. If, however, Government decides to accept such appeal, the Appellate Medical Board will be constituted by the Health Division which will also decide about the date and place for re-examination and also the composition of such Board. The decision of the Appellate Medical Board shall be final unless, after review, the Chief Martial Law Administrator in any case decides otherwise.
