No. S. R. O. 144-L/77.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 133 of the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, the President, after consultation with the Public Service (First) Commission as required by clause (2) of article 140 of that Constitution, is pleased to make the following Rules, namely:—

THE FILM INSPECTORS (BANGLADESH FILM CENSOR BOARD) RECRUITMENT RULES, 1977.

- 1. Short title.—These rules may be called the Film Inspectors (Bangladesh Film Censor Board) Recruitment Rules, 1977.
- 2. Definitions.—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—
 - (a) "appointing authority" means the Government;
 - (b) "Commission" means the Public Service (First) Commission;
 - (c) "probationer" means a person appointed on probation to a specified post;
 - (d) "recognised University" means a University established by or under any law for the time being in force and includes any other University declared by the Government, after consultation with the Commission, to be a recognised University for the purposes of these rules;
 - (e) "requisite qualification" means the qualifications laid down in the Schedule in relation to the specified post;
 - (f) "Schedule" means the Schedule annexed to these rules;
 - (g) "specified post" means the post specified in the Schedule.
- 3. Procedure for recruitment,—(1) Subject to the provisions of the Schedule, appointment to the specified post shall be made—
 - (a) by direct recruitment;
 - (b) by promotion from amongst persons holding other subordinate posts mentioned in the Schedule for the purpose.
- (2) No person shall be appointed to the specified post unless he has the requisite qualifications, and in the case of direct recruitment, he is also within the age limit, if any, prescribed in the Schedule for that post.
- 4. Appointment by direct recruitment.—(1) No appointment to the specified post by direct recruitment shall be made except upon the recommendation of the Commission.

- (2) No person shall be eligible for appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment if he—
 - (a) is not a citizen of Bangladesh;
 - (b) is married to, or has entered into a promise of marriage with, a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.
- (3) No appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made until—
 - (a) the person selected for appointment is certified by a Medical Board set up for the purpose by the Director of Health Services to be medically fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer from any such organic defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the post; and
 - (b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment to Government service.
- (4) No person shall be recommended for appointment to a specified post unless-
 - (a) he applied in such form, accompanied by such fee and before such date, as was notified by the Commission while inviting applications for the post; and
 - (b) in the case of a person already in Government service or in the service of a local authority, he has applied through his official superior.
- 5. Appointment by promotion.—Appointment by promotion to a specified post shall be made after considering the recommendation of such Departmental Promotion Committee as the Government may set up for the purpose and in consultation with the Commission.
- 6. Probation.—(1) Persons selected for appointment to a specified post against a substantive vacancy shall be appointed on probation—
 - (a) in the case of direct recruitment, for a period of two years from the date of substantive appointment; and
 - (b) in the case of promotion, for a period of one year from the date of such appointment.
- (2) Where, during the period of probation of a probationer, the appointing authority is of opinion that his conduct and work is unsatisfactory or that he is not likely to become efficient, it may, before the expiry of that period,—
 - (a) in the case of direct recruitment, terminate the service of the probationer; and
 - (b) in the case of promotion, revert him to the post from which he was promoted.
- (3) After the completion of the period of probation, the appointing authority may—
 - (a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during his period of probation has been satisfactory, shall confirm him; and

- (b) if it is of opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during that period was not satisfactory—
 - (i) in the case of direct recruitment, terminate his service and, in the case of promotion, revert him to the post from which he was promoted; or
 - (ii) extend the period of probation by a period or periods so that the extended period does not exceed two years in the aggregate.
- Explanation.—The period of probation of a probationer shall be deemed to have been extended until any order under this sub-rule has been made.
