No. 417-Min/H.A.(Police-IV).—WHEREAS an incident took place at about midnight following 21st July, 1978 in a tea stall near the gate of Rajarbagh Police Line between some policemen and the owner of the said stall and others resulting in injuries to certain persons;

AND WHEREAS the Government is of the opinion that it is necessary to appoint a Commission of Inquiry for the purpose of making an inquiry into the said incident which is a matter of public importance;

Now, THEREFORE, in exercise of the power conferred by section 3 of the Commission of Inquiry Act, 1956 (VI of 1956), the Government is pleased to appoint a Commission of Inquiry consisting of Mr Badruddin Ahmed, District and Sessions Judge of Dacca, to inquire into the said incident.

The terms of reference of the Commission of Inquiry are as follows:

- (1) to enquire into the circumstances that led to the said incident;
- (2) to identify the person or persons responsible for the incident that resulted in injuries to several persons;
- (3) to suggest appropriate action against the person or persons responsible for the incident; and
- (4) to suggest steps to prevent such incidents in future.

The Commission shall submit its report to the Government by 30th July, 1978.
