- (iii) The manufactured goods are exported out of Bangladesh and an application for repayment of Customs duties is presented to the proper officer of Customs within 60 days of such exportation or of the publication of this notification, whichever is the later.
- (iv) The exporter makes a declaration on the reverse of the original shipping bill or other export documents to the effect that he would claim repayment of the Customs duties paid on the imported raw materials used in the production of the goods being exported.
- (v) The repayment at the rate specified shall be allowed provided that the goods exported are manufactured with the same constituents on which the rate of repayment is notified and the manufacturer-cum-exporter shall immediately intimate to the National Board of Revenue and the Directorate of Inspection and Training (Customs and Excise), Dacca:
- (a) any change in the process of the imported raw materials;
- (b) any changes in the composition of the manufactured goods to be exported; and
- (c) use of any indigenous raw material in place of the imported raw materials.

No. S.R.O. 218-L/75/S-III/IR-2/751255.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Article 133 of the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, the President, after consultation with the Bangladesh Public Service (First) Commission as required by clause (2) of Article 140 of that Constitution, is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

THE DEPARTMENTAL EXAMINATION OF OFFICERS OF THE DIRECTORATE OF LABOUR (MANPOWER AND EMPLOYMENT WING) RULES, 1975.

1. These rules may be called the Departmental Examination of the Directorate of Labour (Manpower and Employment Wing) Rules, 1975.

2. In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—

- (a) "Commission" means the Bangladesh Public Service (First) Commission;
- (b) "Directorate" means the Directorate of Labour (Manpower and Employment Wing); and
- (c) "Schedule" means the Schedule to these rules.

3. (1) An officer of the Directorate other than an officer appointed by the erstwhile Government of Pakistan and transferred to the Directorate on or before the 21st May, 1962, shall be required to pass the departmental examina-

tion as provided in these rules within two years from the date of publication of these rules in the Official Gazette or within two years from the date of their appointment, whichever is later:

Provided that the period may be extended by one year to enable an officer to have the four chances referred to in rule 4 in a case where an officer could not take all the four chances by reason of the half-yearly departmental examination not being held in any half-year or year.

(2) Failure to pass the departmental examination completely within the period specified in sub-rule (1) shall entail loss of appointment or stoppage of increment in the time scale of pay as the Government may decide.

4. An officer shall be allowed four chances in successive departmental examinations to pass the examination completely and if he fails in one or more papers in one examination, he shall be eligible to appear at the subsequent examination only in the subject or subjects in which he failed.

5. An officer who has already been confirmed without having passed any departmental examination shall not be eligible for further promotion unless he passes the examination in the Accounts paper of the departmental examination.

6. (1) The departmental examination shall be conducted under the control and direction of the Commission.

(2) The Director of Labour shall report to the Commission the names of the intending examinees by the 15th February and 15th August each year.

7. The non-Technical officers of the Directorate, namely, Assistant Manager of Employment Exchange, Assistant Youth Employment Officer, Public Relations Officer, Administrative Officer, Research Officer, Assistant Director of Labour, Manager of Employment Exchange, Youth Employment Officer, Deputy Director of Labour and Joint Director of Labour shall be examined in the subjects and according to the syllabus as detailed in Part A of the Schedule.

8. The Technical Officers of the Directorate, namely, Technical Assistant, of Apprenticeship Training, Assistant Director of Apprenticeship Training, Vice-Principal of T. T. Cs., Instructors and Senior Instructor of Marine Diesel Training Centre, Principal of T. T. Cs., Principal of Marine Diesel Training Centre shall be examined in the subjects and according to the syllabus as detailed in Part B of the Schedule.

9. (1) An officer of the Directorate who does not know Bengali shall be required to pass an examination in Bengali as detailed in Part C of the Schedule.

(2) Time allowed for written examination in Bengali shall be 2 hours and for dictation or *viva voce* the time shall not be more than half an hour.

10. Subject to sub-rule (2) of rule 9, there shall be allowed 3 hours for each subject and minimum pass marks in each subject is 90.

AWARD

This is an application under section 25(1)(b) of the Bangladesh Employment of Labour (Standing Orders) Act, 1965. Briefly stated Case of the petitioner is that he was peon under O. P. No. 1 and that a charge-sheet was framed against the petitioner on 14-1-1974 and that on a false plea petitioner was made to confess his guilt and that he deposited Tk. 1,087.00 and promised to deposit further Tk. 600.00. That the petitioner is under suspension for about a year and inspite of legal notice no reply is given by the O. P. and as such petitioner has filed this Case for declaration that the petitioner is still in service.

O. P. by filing W/O. contends that the Case being filed without filing a grievance petition under section 25(1) of the Standing Orders Act is not maintainable and the Case is liable to be dismissed *in limine*. On the merit of the Case the contention of the O. P. is that petitioner confessed his guilt and that Head Office, *i.e.*, the appointing authority dismissed the petitioner on 27-3-1974, which was duly communicated to the petitioner and as such there is no basis of the allegation that petitioner is still under suspension and as such O. P. contends that Case be dismissed.

The Case is taken up for hearing on the ground of maintainability. It is admitted that petitioner was charge-sheeted and placed under suspension. According to petitioner he is still under suspension whereas according to the O. P. the petitioner was already dismissed as late on 27-3-1974. Admittedly petitioner has filed this Case under section 25(1)(b) of the Standing Orders Act, which presupposes that a grievance petition as envisaged under section 25(1) of the Standing Orders Act must be submitted before filing of the Case which is not done in this Case and as such the Case is not maintainable under section 25(1)(b) of the Standing Orders Act and is liable to be dismissed *in limine*.

Considered the written opinion of the learned members.

MINISTRY OF POST, TELEGRAPH AND TELEPHONE

RESOLUTION

Dacca, the 26th June, 1975.

No. T&T/1D-9/74.—Whereas it is necessary to provide for the establishment of a Board for the better management, maintenance and development of telegraph and telephone;

It is, therefore, hereby resolved that a Board to be called the Telegraph and Telephone Board be established for the purposes and with powers and functions specified below:—

1. **Composition of the Board.**—The Board shall consist of the following members, namely:—

- (a) the Minister of State for Post, Telegraph and Telephone, who shall also be the Chairman of the Board;
- (b) the Secretary, Ministry of Post, Telegraph and Telephone;
- (c) the Director-General, Telegraph and Telephone;
- (d) the Financial Adviser, Ministry of Post, Telegraph and Telephone;
- (e) the Divisional Chief, Tele-communications, Planning Commission; and
- (f) a Deputy Secretary to the Government in the Ministry of Post, Telegraph and Telephone to be nominated by that Ministry, who shall also be the Secretary of the Board.

2. **Meetings of the Board.**—(1) The meetings of the Board shall be held at such times and places as may be prescribed by regulations:

Provided that until regulations are made in this behalf, such meetings shall be held at such times and places as may be determined by the Chairman.

(2) To constitute a quorum at a meeting of the Board, not less than three members, including the Chairman, shall be present.

(3) All questions at a meeting of the Board shall be decided by a majority of the members present and voting, and in the case of equality of votes, the person presiding shall have a second or casting vote.

(4) All meetings of the Board shall be presided over by the Chairman or, in his absence, by a member authorised by him in this behalf.

3. **Functions of the Board.**—(1) It shall be the function of the Board to provide efficient telegraph and telephone services and to do all acts and things necessary for the development of telegraphs and telephones.

(2) In particular and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing provision, the Board shall have power, with the approval of the Government,—

- (a) to prepare and execute development plans;
- (b) to associate with any international organisation engaged in any activity falling within the functions of the Board;

(c) to establish and maintain institutes for the instruction and training of persons engaged in any activities connected with telegraphs and telephones; and

(d) to do all other things connected with, or ancillary to, any of the matters referred to in clauses (a) to (c).

(3) The Board in discharging its functions shall act on commercial considerations having due regard to public interest generally and shall be guided on questions of policy by such general or special instructions as may be given to it by the Government from time to time.

4. **Appointment of officers and other employees.**—The Board may, with the approval of the Government, appoint such officers and other employees as it considers necessary for the efficient performance of its functions on such terms and conditions as it may deem fit.

5. **Fund of the Board.**—(1) There shall be formed a fund to be known as the Telegraph and Telephone Board Fund which shall vest in the Board and shall be utilised by the Board to meet charges in connection with its functions including the payment of salaries and other remuneration to the officers and other employees of the Board.

(2) To the credit of the Telegraph and Telephone Board Fund shall be placed—

(a) grants made by the Government;

(b) loans obtained from the Government;

(c) loans raised by the Board;

(d) foreign aid loans obtained with the sanction of the Government; and

(e) all other sums received by the Board.

6. **Borrowing power.**—The Board may, with the approval of the Government, borrow money for carrying out the purposes of this Resolution or for servicing any loan obtained by it.

7. **Budget.**—The Board shall, by such date in each year as may be fixed by the Government, submit to the Government for approval a budget in such form as may be prescribed by the Government, for each financial year showing the estimated receipt and expenditure and the sums which are likely to be required from the Government during that financial year.

8. **Accounts and audit.**—(1) The Board shall maintain its accounts in such manner and form as the Government may, in consultation with the Comptroller and Auditor-General of Bangladesh (hereinafter referred to as the Auditor-General), prescribe.

(2) The accounts of the Board shall be audited by the Auditor-General in such manner as he deems fit.

(3) For the purpose of an audit under sub-paragraph (2), the Auditor-General or any person authorised by him in that behalf shall have access to all records, books, documents, cash, securities, stores and other property of the Board and may examine any member, officer or other employee of the Board.

(4) The Auditor-General shall submit his audit report to the Government and forward a copy thereof to the Board.

9. **Submission of reports, etc.**—(1) The Board shall submit to the Government, as soon as possible after the end of every financial year, a report on the conduct of its affairs for that year.

(2) The Board shall submit to the Government at such times and intervals as the Government may specify—

- (a) such returns, accounts, statements, estimates and statistics as may be required by the Government;
- (b) information and comments asked for by the Government on any specific subject;
- (c) copies of documents required by the Government for examination or any other purpose.

10. **Power to make regulations.**—(1) The Board may, with the previous approval of the Government, make regulations to provide for all matters for which provision is necessary or expedient for carrying out the purposes of this Resolution.

(2) All regulations made under this paragraph shall be published in the official gazette.
