In the aforesaid Rules, in rule 39, in sub-rule (1), in the Schedule, for serial No. 1 the following shall be substituted, namely:—

No. S.R.O. 230.L/77.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Article 133 of the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, the President, after consultation with the Bangladesh Public Service (Second) Commission as required by clause (2) of Article 140 of that Constitution, is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

THE ECONOMIC INVESTIGATOR RECRUITMENT RULES, 1977.

1. **Short title.**—These rules may be called the Economic Investigator Recruitment Rules, 1977.
2. **Definition.**—In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 - (a) "appointing authority" means the Government and includes, in relation to the specified post, any officer authorised by Government to make appointment to the post;
 - (b) "Commission" means the Bangladesh Public Service (Second) Commission;
 - (c) "probationer" means a person appointed on probation to the post;
 - (d) "Post" means the post of Economic Investigator;
 - (e) "recognised University" means a University established by or under any law for the time being in force and includes any other University declared by Government, after consultation with the Commission, to be a recognised University for the purposes of these rules;
 - (f) "requisite qualification" in relation to the post, means the qualification specified in the Schedule; and
 - (g) "Schedule" means the Schedule annexed to these rules.
3. **Procedure for recruitment.**—(1) Subject to the provisions of the Schedule, appointment to the post shall be made—
 - (a) by direct recruitment; or
 - (b) by promotion.
 (2) No person shall be appointed to the post unless he has the requisite qualification, and in the case of direct recruitment, he is within the age limit specified in the Schedule.
4. **Appointment by direct recruitment.**—(1) No appointment to the post shall be made except upon the recommendation of the Commission.
 - (2) No person shall be eligible for appointment to the post if he—
 - (a) is not a citizen of Bangladesh, or a permanent resident of, or domiciled in Bangladesh;
 - (b) is married to, or has entered into a promise of marriage with, a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.

- (3) No appointment to the post shall be made until—
- (a) the person selected for appointment is certified by a Medical Board set up for the purpose by the Director of Health Services to be medically fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer from any such organic defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the post; and
 - (b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agency and found to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment in the service of the Republic.
- (4) No person shall be recommended by the Commission for appointment to the post unless—
- (a) he applied in such form, accompanied by such fee and before such date, as was notified by the Commission while inviting applications for the post; and
 - (b) in the case of a person already in Government service or in the service in a local authority or a statutory corporation, he has applied through his official superior.

5. **Appointment by promotion.**—Appointment by promotion to the post shall be made by the appointing authority after considering the recommendation of such Departmental Promotion Committee as the Government may set up for the purpose and in consultation with the Commission.

6. **Probation.**—(1) Persons selected for appointment to the post against a substantive vacancy shall be appointed on probation—

- (a) in the case of direct recruitment, for a period of two years from the date of substantive appointment; and
- (b) in the case of promotion, for a period of one year from the date of such appointment:

Provided that the appointing authority may, for reasons to be recorded in writing, extend the period of probation by a period or periods so that the extended period does not exceed one year in aggregate.

(2) After the completion of the period of probation, the appointing authority,—

- (a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during the period of probation has been satisfactory, shall confirm; and

- (b) if it is of opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during the period was not satisfactory, may, in the case of direct recruitment, terminate his service and, in the case of promotion, revert him to the post from which he was promoted.
