NOTIFICATION

Dacca, the 28th August 1978.

No. S.R.O. 235-L/78/AA-1/8E-58/77/213.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 133 of the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, the President, after consultation with the Bangladesh Public Service Commission as required by clause (2) of article 140 of that Constitution, is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

THE GAZETTED OFFICERS' RECRUITMENT RULES
(INSPECTORATE OF BOILERS), 1978.

1. Short title.—These rules may be called the Gazetted Officers' Recruitment Rules (Inspectorate of Boilers), 1978.

2. Definitions.—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context:—

(a) "appointing authority" means the Government and includes, in relation to any specified post, any officer authorised by Government to make appointment to such post;

(b) "Commission" means the Bangladesh Public Service Commission;

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- (c) "Probationer" means a person appointed on probation to a specified post;
- (d) "recognised University" means a University established by or under any law for the time being in force and includes any other University declared by Government after consultation with the Commission, to be a recognised University for the purpose of these rules;
- (e) "requisite qualification", in relation to a specified post, means the qualification as laid down in the Schedule in relation to that post;
- (f) "Schedule" means the Schedule appended to these rules; and
- (g) "specified post" means a post specified in the Schedule.

3. Procedure for recruitment.—(1) Subject to the provisions of the Schedule, appointment to a specified post shall be made—

- (a) by direct recruitment; or
- (b) by promotion.

(2) No person shall be appointed to a specified post without prior consultation with the Commission and unless he has the requisite qualification, and in the case of direct recruitment, he is also within the age limit specified in the Schedule for that post.

4. Appointment by direct recruitment.—(1) No person shall be eligible for appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment, if he—

- (a) is not a citizen of Bangladesh, or is not a permanent resident of, or domiciled in, Bangladesh; and
- (b) is married to, or has entered into a promise of marriage with, a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.

(2) No appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made until—

- (a) the person selected for appointment is certified by a Medical Board set up for the purpose by the Director of Health Service to be medically fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer from any such organic defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the specified post; and
- (b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment in the service of the Republic.

5. Probation.—(1) Persons selected for appointment to a specified post against a substantive vacancy shall be appointed on probation—

- (a) in the case of direct recruitment, for a period of two years from the date of substantive appointment; and

- (b) in the case of promotion, for a period of one year from the date of such appointment:

Provided that the appointing authority may, for reasons to be recorded in writing, extend the period of probation by a period or periods so that the extended period does not exceed two years in the aggregate.

- (c) Soon after the completion of the period of probation including the extended period, if any, the appointing authority—

(a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during the period of probation has been satisfactory, shall, subject to the provision of sub-rule (3), confirm him; and

(b) if it is of the opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during the period was not satisfactory may, in the case of direct recruitment, terminate his service, and, in the case of promotion, revert him to the post from which he was promoted.

- (d) A probationer shall not be confirmed in a specified post until he has passed such training as the Government may, from time to time, direct.

(a) Must have Degree in Mechanical Engineering from a recognised University or Diploma in Mechanical Engineering with 5 years experience in the field.

(b) Must have—

(i) knowledge of the various types of boilers used on land and of the purpose and functions of their component parts;

(ii) ability to determine accurately the working pressure of a boiler in accordance with the Boilers Regulations;

(iii) knowledge of the construction and materials used in the manufacture of Boilers;
