BUREAU OF ANTI-CORRUPTION

NOTIFICATION

Dacca, the 1st September, 1979.

No. S.R.O. 239-L/79/14R-19/CD(AC)/79.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 133 of the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, the President, after consultation with Bangladesh Public Service Commission, as required by clause (2) of article 140 of that Constitution, is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

THE PUBLIC PROSECUTOR (BUREAU OF ANTI-CORRUPTION) RECRUITMENT RULES, 1979.

- 1. Short title.—These rules may be called the Public Prosecutor (Bureau of Anti-Corruption) Recruitment Rules, 1979.
- 2. Definitions.—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—
 - (a) "appointing authority" means the Government and includes any officer authorised by the Government to make appointment to the post;
 - (b) "Commission" means the Bangladesh Public Service Commission;
 - (c) "probationer" means a person appointed on probation to the post;
 - (d) "post" means the post of Public Prosecutor in the Bureau of Anti-Corruption;

- (e) "recognised University" means a University established by or under any law for the time being in force and includes any other University declared by the Government, after consultation with the Commission, to be a recognised University for the purpose of these rules;
- (f) "requisite qualification" means the qualification as specified in the Schedule; and
- (g) "Schedule" means the Schedule annexed to these rules.
- 3. Method of Recruitment,—(1) Subject to the provisions of the Schedule appointment to the post shall be made—
 - (a) by direct recruitment; or
 - (b) by transfer on deputation.
- (2) No person shall be appointed to the post unless he has the requisite qualification and, in the case of direct recruitment, he is also within the age-limit laid down in the Schedule.
- 4. Appointment by direct recruitment.—(1) No appointment to the post by direct recruitment shall be made by the appointing authority except upon the recommendation of the Commission.
 - (2) No person shall be eligible for appointment to the post if he-
 - (a) is not a citizen of Bangladesh; or
 - (b) is married to, or has entered into a promise of marriage with, a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.
 - (3) No appointment to the post by direct recruitment shall be made until-
 - (a) the person selected for appointment is certified by a Medical Board set up for the purpose by the Director of Health Services to be medically fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer from any such organic defect as is likely to interfere with the duties of the post; and
 - (b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment in the service of the Republic.
 - (4) No person shall be recommended for appointment to the post unless-
 - (a) he applied in such form, accompanied by such fee and before such date, as notified by the Commission while inviting applications for the post; and
 - (b) in the case of a person already in Government service or in the service of a local authority, he applied through proper channel.

5. Probation.—(1) Person selected for appointment to the post against substantive vacancy shall be appointed on probation for a period of two years from the date of substantive appointment:

Provided that the appointing authority may, for reason to be recorded in writing, extend the period of probation by a period or periods so that the extended period does not exceed two years in the aggregate.

- (2) Where, during the period of probation, the appointing authority is of the opinion that his conduct and work is not satisfactory, it may, before the expiry of that period terminate his service.
- (3) After the satisfactory completion of the period of probation, including the extended period, if any, the appoining authority—
 - (a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during the period of probation has been satisfactory, confirm him;
 - (b) if it is of the opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during that period was not satisfactory may terminate his service.
