**NOTIFICATION**

**Dhaka, the 13th June 1985**

No. S. R. O. 265-L/85/FA-47/84(Poll-IV)/492.—Whereas the Government is of opinion that it is expedient for the public safety to prohibit absolutely the manufacture, possession and importation of explosives in Bangladesh;

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 6(1)(a) of the Explosives Act, 1884 (IV of 1884), the Government is pleased to prohibit absolutely the manufacture, possession and importation of explosives in Bangladesh:

Provided that the recognised industries in Bangladesh having import entitlement for sulphur and potassium chloride as recorded in the pass books issued to them by the import Control Authority shall be exempt from the operation of the prohibition under this Notification.
