NOTIFICATION

Dacea, the 13th October, 1979.

No. S.R.O. 292-L/79.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Article 133 of the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, the President, after consultation with the Bangladesh Public Service Commission as required by clause (2) of Article 140 of that Constitution, is pleased to make the following rules, namely :-

THE DEPUTY CHIEF, ASSISTANT CHIEF AND EVALUATION OFFICER (PLANNING AND IMPLEMENTATION CELL, MINISTRY OF CIVIL AVIATION AND TOURISM) RECRUITMENT RULES, 1979.

- 1. Short title.—These rules may be called the Deputy Chief, Assistant Chief and Evaluation Officer (Planning and Implementation Cell, Ministry of Civil Aviation and Tourism) Recruitment Rules, 1979.
- 2. Definitions .- In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,-
 - (a) "appointing authority" means the Government and includes, in relation to any specified post or class of such posts, any officer authorised by the Government to make appointment to such post or class of posts;
 - (b) "Commission" means the Bangladesh Public Service Commission;
 - (e) "Probationer" means a person appointed on probation to a specified post;

- (d) "Recognised University" means a University established by or under any law for the time being in force and includes any other University declared by the Government, after consultation with the Commission, to be a recognised University for the purpose of these rules;
- (e) "Requisite Qualification" in relation to a specified post, means the qualification laid down in the schedule in relation to the post;
- (f) "Schedule" means the Schedule annexed to these rules; and
- (g) "Specified post" means a post specified in the schedule.
- 3. Procedure for recruitment.—(1) Subject to the provisions of the Schedule and instructions relating to reservation for the purpose of clause (3) of Article 29 of the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, appointment to a specified post shall be made-
 - (a) by direct recruitment; or
 - (b) by promotion.
- (2) No person shall be appointed to a specified post unless he has the requisite qualification and, in the case of direct recruitment, he is also within the age limit laid down in the Schedule for that post.
- 4. Appointment by direct recruitment.—(1) No appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made except upon the recommendation of the Commission.
- (2) No person shall be eligible for appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment, if he-
 - (a) is not a citizen of Bangladesh, or a permanent resident of Bangladesh: Provided that this clause shall not apply in the case of a person who is already in the service of the Republic;
 - (b) is married to, or has entered into a promise of marriage with, a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.
- (3) No appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made, until-
 - (a) the person selected for appointment is certified by a Medical Board set up for the purpose by the Director of Health Services to be medically fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer from any such organic defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the specified post; and
 - (b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment in the service of the Republic.
- (4) No person shall be recommended for appointment to a specified post, unless-
 - (a) he applied in such form, accompanied by such fee and before such date, as was notified by the Commission while inviting applications for the specified post; and
 - (b) in the case of a person already in Government service or in the service of a local authority, he applied through his official superior,

5. Appointment by promotion.—(1) Appointment by promotion to a specified post shall be made on the recommendation of the Departmental Promotion Committee constituted by the Government in this behalf:

Provided that appointment by promotion to a specified post of higher class shall be made on the recommendation of the Commission.

- (2) A person shall not be eligible for appointment by promotion to a specified post if he has unsatisfactory records of service.
- 6. Probation.—(1) Persons selected for appointment to a specified post against a substantive vacancy shall be appointed on probation,—
 - (a) in the case of direct recruitment, for a period of two years from the date of substantive appointment; and
 - (b) in the case of promotion, for a period of one year from the date of such appointment:

Provided that the appointing authority may, for reasons to be recorded in writing, extend the period of probation by a period or periods so that the extended period does not exceed two years in the aggregate.

- (2) Where, during the period of probation of a probationer, the appointing authority is of opinion that his conduct and work is unsatisfactory or that he is not likely to become efficient, it may, before the expiry of that period—
 - (a) in the case of direct recruit, terminate his service; and
 - (b) in the case of promotion, revert him to the post from which he was promoted.
- (3) After the completion of the period of probation including the extended period, if any, the appointing authority,—
 - (a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during his period of probation has been saltisfactory, shall, subject to the provisions of sub-rule (4), confirm him; and
 - (b) if it is of opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during that period was not satisfactory, may,—
 - (i) in the case of direct recruitment, terminate his service; and
 - (ii) in the case of promotion, revert him to the post from which he was promoted.
- (4) A probationer shall not be confirmed in a specified post until he has passed such examination and undergone such training as the Government may, from time to time, direct.

PROCLAMATION

Whereas it has been made to appear to me that accuseds (1) Noor Mohammed, son of Fazla of Mumar Para, P.S. Araihazar, Dist. Dacca, (2) Abul Hashem, son of late Jalaluddin of Senpara (Bashirpara Camp), P.S. Rupganj, district Dacca, (3) Alauddin, son of Amiruddin of Dayet Maitpur, P.S. Steenagar, district Dacca, are required for the purpose of trial in the Special Tribunal Court No. VI and Special Judge, Court No. 1, Dacca under Ordinance No. XIV/77;

And whereas the Court has reason to believe that the said accused (1) Noor Mohammad, (2) Abul Hashem and (3) Alauddin are absconding or concealing themselves to avoid appearance or arrest for the said purpose;

Now, therefore, in exercise of that power conferred by Ordinance No. KIV/77 this Tribunal Court No. VI at Dacca do hereby direct—

That the above accuseds persons to appear in this Court on 10th November 1979, failing which they will be tried in absentia in the Case No. \$372/77 and their properties may be confiscated to the Government.
