NOTIFICATION

Dacca, the 21st November, 1979.

No. S.R.O. 322-L/79.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 133 of the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, the President, after consultation with the Bangladesh Public Service Commission as required by clause (2) of article 140 of the Constitution, is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

THE CIVILIAN MIDWIFE (BANGLADESH ARMY) RECRUITMENT RULES, 1979.

- 1. Short title.—These rules may be called the Civilian Midwife (Bangladesh Army) Recruitment Rules, 1979.
 - 2. Definitions.—In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 - (a) "appointing authority" means the Government and includes any officer authorised by Government in this behalf;
 - (b) "Commission" means the Bangladesh Public Service Commission;
 - (c) "Probationer" means a person appointed on probation to the specified post;
 - (d) "recognised Board" means a Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education established by or under any law for the time being in force and includes any other Board declared by Government, after consultation with the Commission, to be a recognised Board for the purpose of these rules;

- (e) "requisite qualification" in relation to the specified post, means the qualification laid down in the Schedule;
- (f) "Schedule" means the Schedule annexed to these rules; and
- (g) "specified post" means the post specified in the Schedule.
- 3. Procedure for recruitment.—(1) Subject to the provisions of the Schedule and such instructions relating to reservations for the purpose of clause (3) of article 29 of the Constitution, appointment to the specified post shall be made—
 - (a) by direct recruitment; or
 - (b) by transfer on deputation.
- (2) No person shall be appointed by the appointing authority to the specified post unless she has the requisite qualification and, she is also within the age limit specified in the Schedule for the post.
- 4. Appointment by direct recruitment.—(1) No person shall be eligible for appointment to the specified post by direct recruitment, if she—
 - (a) is not a citizen of Bangladesh, or a permanent resident of, or domiciled in, Bangladesh;
 - (b) is married to, or has entered into a promise of marriage with, a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.
- (2) No appointment to the specified post by direct recruitment shall be
 - (a) the person selected for appointment is certified by a Medical Officer not below the rank of Civil Surgeon to be medically fit for such appointment and that she does not suffer from any such organic defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the specified post; and
 - (b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render her unfit for appointment in the service of the Republic.
- Probation.—(1) Persons selected for appointment to the specified post by direct recruitment against a substantive vacancy shall be appointed on probation for a period of two years from the date of substantive appointment.
- (2) After the completion of the period of probation, the appointing authority,—
 - (a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during her period of probation has been satisfactory, shall confirm her; and
 - (b) if it is of opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during that period was not satisfactory, may,—
 - (i) terminate her service; or
 - (ii) extend the period of probation by a period or periods so that the extended period does not exceed two years in the aggregate.
