No. S.R.O. 363-L/84/IV-29/79.—In pursuance of the Proclamation of the 24th March, 1982, and in exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf, the President and Chief Martial Law Administrator is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

THE KANUNGOS RECRUITMENT RULES, 1984

- Short title.—These rules may be called the Kanungos Recruitment Rules, 1984.
- 2. Definitions.—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—
 - (a) "appointing authority" means the Government and includes any officer authorised by the Government to make appointment to the specified post;
 - (b) "Commission" means the Bangladesh Public Service Commission;
 - (c) "probationer" means a person appointed on probation to the specified post;
 - (d) "recognised Board" means a Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education established by or under any law for the time being in force and includes any other Board declared by the Government, after consultation with the Commission, to be a recognised Board for the purposes of these rules;
 - (e) "recognised University" means a University established by or under any law for the time being in force and includes any other University declared by the Government, after consultation with the Commission, to be a recognised University for the purposes of these rules;

- (f) "requisite qualification" in relation to the specified post, means the qualification laid down in the Schedule in relation to that post;
- (g) "Schedule" means the Schedule annexed to these rules; and
- (h) "specified post" means the post specified in the Schedule.
- 3. Procedure for recruitment.—(1) Subject to the provision of the Schedule appointment to the specified post shall be made—
 - (a) by direct recruitment; or
 - (b) by promotion.
- (2) No person shall be appointed to the specified post unless he has requisite qualification and, in the case of direct recruitment, he is also within the age limit laid down in the Schedule for the post.
- Appointment by direct recruitment.—(1) No appointment to the specified
 post by direct recruitment shall be made except upon the recommendation of the
 Commission.
- (2) No person shall be eligible for appointment to the specified post by direct recruitment, if he—
 - (a) is not a citizen of Bangladesh, or a permanent resident of, or domiciled in, Bangladesh:

Provided that this clause shall not apply in the case of a person who is already in the service of the Republic;

- (b) is married to, or has entered into a promise of marriage with, a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.
- (3) No appointment to the specified post by direct recruitment shall be made until—
 - (a) the person selected for appointment is certified by a medical officer duly authorised by the Government in this behalf to be medically fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer from any such organic defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the specified post; and
 - (b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment in the services of the Republic.
- (4) No person shall be recommended for appointment to the specified post unless—
 - (a) he applied in such form, accompanied by such fee and before such date, as was notified by the Commission while inviting applications for the specified post; and
 - (b) in the case of a person already in Government service or in the service of a local authority, he applied through his official superior.

- (5) Persons recommended for appointment to the specified post shall undergo a course of training for 2 months under the Directorate of Land Records and Surveys and, at the end of such training, a competitive examination shall be held by the Director General, Land Records and Surveys and only the successful candidates securing a minimum of 45% marks in the examination shall be appointed to the specified post.
- 5. Appointment by promotion.—(1) Appointment by promotion to the specified post shall be made on the recommendation of such Departmental Promotion Committee as the Government may constitute in this behalf.
- (2) A person shall not be eligible for appointment by promotion to the specified post if he has unsatisfactory records of service.
 - (3) Selection shall be made on the basis of seniority-cum-merit.
- (4) Seniority, shall be counted from the date of entry into the post from which promotion shall be made.
- 6. Probation.—(1) A person selected for appointment to the specified post against a substantive vacancy shall be appointed on probation,—
 - (a) in the case of direct recruitment, for a period of two years from the date of substantive appointment; and
 - (b) in the case of promotion, for a period of one year from the date of such appointment:

Provided that the appointing authority may, for reasons to be recorded in writing, extend the period of probation by a period or periods so that the extended period does not exceed two years in the aggregate.

- (2) Where, during the period of probation of a probationer, the appointing authority is of opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer is unsatisfactory or that he is not likely to become efficient, it may, before the expiry of that period,—
 - (a) in the case of direct recruitment terminate his service; and
 - (b) in the case of promotion, revert him to the post from which he was promoted.
- (3) After the completion of the period of probation including the extended period, if any, the appointing authority,—
 - (a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during his
 period of probation has been satisfactory, shall, subject to the provisions
 of sub-rule (4), confirm him; and
 - (b) if it is of opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during that period was not satisfactory, may;—
 - (i) in the case of direct recruitment, terminate his service; and
 - (ii) in the case of promotion, revert him to the post from which he was promoted.

- (4) A probationer shall not be confirmed in the specified post until he has passed such examination and undergone such training as the Government may, from time to time, prescribe by order.
- 7. Supersession of other rules and orders.—These rules superseded all previous rules and orders regulating the recruitment of the District Kanungos and the provisions contained in the Bengal Survey and Settlement Manual, 1935, in so far as the recruitment of the Settlement Kanungos is concerned.

Secondary School Certificate from a recognised Board and must have passed Survey Training or Ameenship examination at the Survey Institute, Comilla, with at least 12 years' continuous service

No. S.R.O. 364-L/84/PT/SEC-III/M-20/84_340.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the Post Office Act, 1898 (VI of 1898), the Government is pleased to make the following further amendments in the Post Office Rules, 1961, namely:—

In the aforesaid Rules,-

- (1) in rule 13, in the proviso, for clause (b), the following shall be substituted, namely:—
 - "(b) Their dimensions are not greater than 15 by 10.5 and 10 by 7 centimetres, and";
- (2) in rule 15, in sub-rule (3), in clause (c), for the figures and words "2 inches" and "3/4 inches" the figures and words "5 centimetres" and "2 centimetres" shall respectively be substituted;
- (3) in rule 17, in sub-rules (1) and (3), for the words "five miles" occurring twice the words "eight kilometres" shall be substituted in both the places;
- (4) in rule 22, for sub-rule (1), the following shall be substituted, namely:—
 - "(1) The dimensions of a book packet, which may be of any shape, shall not exceed sixty centimetres in length by thirty centimetres in width and thirty centimetres in depth. When, however, the packet is in the form of a roll, the length shall not exceed seventy-five centimetres:

Provided that, if the length exceeds sixty centimetres, the diameter shall not exceed ten centimetres";

- (5) in rule 27, for sub-rule (1) the following shall be substituted, namely:-
 - "(1) The dimensions of a pattern or sample packet shall not exceed sixty centimetres in length by thirty centimetres in width and thirty centimetres in depth; and weight shall not exceed two and a half kilograms:

Provided that the Director-General may, in special circumstances, fix a lower limit of weight for pattern and sample packet, for and from any particular post office or offices.";

- (6) in rule 30, for clause (d), the following shall be substituted, namely:-
- "(d) The dimensions of the packet shall not exceed sixty centimetres in length by thirty centimetres in width and thirty centimetres in depth; and the weight shall not exceed eight kilograms or any lower limit that may be prescribed by the Director General for and from a particular post office or offices.";

- (7) in rule 36, for sub-rules (1) and (2), the following shall be substituted, namely:—
 - "(1) The weight of an unregistered parcel shall not exceed five kilograms; and the weight of a registered parcel shall not exceed—
 - (a) twenty-eight kilograms, if it contains official documen's for the Chief of the General Staff or the Commander-in-Chief of Baugladesh; and
 - (b) eleven and a half kilograms, if any other case.
 - (2) The length of a parcel shall not exceed one metre and the length and girth combined shall not exceed one and eighteenth of a metre.";
- (8) in rule 37, for the figures, words and brackets "12½ seers (1000 tolas)" the figures and word "11½ kilograms" shall be substituted;
- (9) in rule 39,-
 - (a) in clause (c), for the words "three-fourths of an inch" the words "two centimetres" shall be substituted; and
 - (b) in clause (d), for the words "three inches" the words "seven and a half centimetres" shall be substituted;
- (10) in rule 41, in clause (b), for the words "three-quarters of an inch" the words "two centimetres" shall be substituted;
- (11) in rule 45,-
 - (a) in clause (a) for the words "one and three-quarters inches" the words "four and a half centimetres" shall be substituted;
 - (b) in clause (b), for the words "one-quarter of an inch" the words "six centimetres" shall be substituted; and
 - (c) in clause (c), for the words "one inch" the words "two and a half centimetres" shall be substituted;
- (12) in rule 76, in sub-rule (1), in clause (a), for the figure and word "440 tolas" the words "five kilograms" shall be substituted.
