No. S. R. O. 34-L/78/397/D/CUS.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 219 of the Customs Act, 1969 (IV of 1969), the National Board of Revenue is pleased to make the following further amendments in the 'Privileged Persons' Baggage Rules, 1974, namely:—

In the aforesaid Rules,—

(1) in rule 4, after sub-rule (2), the following new sub-rule (3) shall be added, namely:—

“(3) The pass book issued to a privileged person under sub-rule (1) shall remain valid for one year from the date of issue and thereafter the pass book shall be submitted to the issuing authority one month before the date of expiry for renewal along with a certificate from the administrative Ministry concerned to the effect that the holder of the pass book still continues in his assignment in Bangladesh and that he is likely to continue in the same assignment for a further period of one year.”;

(2) in rule 5, after 'sub-rule (1)', the following new sub-rule (1a) shall be inserted, namely:—

“(1a) The registration number of the car imported by a privileged person or purchased with the concurrence of the Board from another privileged person free of customs-duties shall be intimated by the organisation to which he is attached to the Collector of Customs of the area within 10 days of its registration or purchase, as the case may be, and the Collector of Customs shall maintain a registrar for, and keep vigilance over, such cars.”;

(3) rule 6 shall be re-numbered as sub-rule (1) of that rule and—

(a) in sub-rule (1) as so re-numbered, after the word “Board” at the end, the words and commas “and, after such verification, shall issue a clearance certificate” shall be added; and

(b) after sub-rule (1) amended as aforesaid, the following new sub-rule (2) shall be added, namely:—

“(2) A privileged person shall produce, at the time of departure from Bangladesh, the clearance certificate issued under sub-rule (1) to the officer of customs at the exit point without which customs clearance shall not be allowed.”.

O. 35-L/78/398/D/Cus.—In exercise of the powers conferred by clauses (b) and (c) of section 21 of the Customs Act, 1969 (IV of 1969), the National Board of Revenue is pleased to direct that the following amendments shall be made in its Order No. S.R.O.14-L/78/395/D/Cus., dated the 23rd January 1978, namely:—

In the aforesaid order,—

(1) in paragraph (b), in sub-paragraph (iii), for the words “one year” the words “two years” shall be substituted;

(2) in Annex 1, under the Head “B. PACKAGING MATERIALS USED EXCLUSIVELY IN THE MANUFACTURE OF PHARMACEUTICAL PRODUCTS”, after serial No. (vii), the following shall be added, namely:—

“(viii) Amber Glass Tablet Vials

(ix) Aluminium/Metallic Foils-printed or plain

(x) Aluminium Seals for Anti-biotic Vials

- (xi) Caps-Bakelite/Metallic/Polythene-all sizes with embossing or printed.
- (xii) Cellophane/Polyfilm/Viscose/Plastic packing film printed or plain
- (xiii) Files for cutting ampoules
- (xiv) Glass Bottles/Jars/Phials/Ampoules/Tubes/Vials all sorts
- (xv) Rubber bungs/Stoppers/Teats and polythene Plugs
- (xvi) Rubber discs and wads
- (xvii) Stoppers/Plugs
- (xviii) Tubular Vials
- (xix) White clear bottles with name of company embossed strip packing materials printed with the name of medicines, the following only:—
 - (a) Aluminium foil polythene-lined
 - (b) Lacquered Aluminium foil
 - (c) Pliofilm acetate, polythene-lined
 - (d) Viscose film (Moisture-Proof and Head-sealable)
 - (e) Polythene Rolls and coils
 - (f) Polythene coated papers
 - (g) Aluminium/Metal collapsible tubes with caps (printed with name of medicines for ointment packing);
and

(3) in Annex 11, under the Head "B. PACKAGING MATERIALS USED IN THE MANUFACTURE OF PHARMACEUTICAL PRODUCTS BUT NOT EXCLUSIVELY",—

- (a) the serial Nos. (i), (ii), (iv), (viii), (ix), (xi), (xiii), (xiv) and (xv) and entries relating thereto shall be *omitted*; and
- (b) after serial No. (xxxix), the following shall be *added*, namely:—
 - "(xxxix) Amber Glass bottles
 - (xl) Neutral Glass ampoules
 - (xli) Aluminium Foil Plain (unpacked)".
