No. S.R.O. 66-L/75-137-MFCS/XV.—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Control of Essential Commodities Act, 1956 (E. P. Act I of 1956), the Government is pleased to make the following further amendment in the Foodgrains (Disposal and Acquisition) Order, 1948, namely:—

In the aforesaid Order, in paragraph 3, for sub-paragraph (5) the following shall be substituted, namely:—

- "(5) Any person who is aggrieved by an order under sub-paragraph (1) may prefer an appeal, within seven days from the date of receipt of the order, to an officer immediate superior to the Requiring Authority. Such superior officer may dispose of the appeal himself or transfer it to any other officer, other than the Requiring Authority, for disposal; and the decision of such superior officer or, as the case may be, the officer to whom the appeal is transferred for disposal shall be final.
- (6) The officer hearing the appeal under sub-paragraph (5) shall have the power to enhance the quantity of foodgrains required by the Requiring Authority to be sold under sub-paragraph (1) if he thinks fit:

Provided that the appellant shall have the option to withdraw the appeal before its hearing.".

THE BANGLADESH LEGAL PRACTITIONERS AND BAR COUNCIL (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE, 1975

Ordinance No. III of 1975

AN

ORDINANCE

further to amend the Bangladesh Legal Practitioners and Bar Council Order, 1972.

WHEREAS it is expedient further to amend the Bangladesh Legal Practitioners and Bar Council Order, 1972 (P.O. No. 46 of 1972), for the purposes hereinafter appearing;

AND WHEREAS Parliament is not in session and the President is satisfied that circumstances exist which render immediate action necessary;

Now, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (1) of Article 93 of the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh the President is pleased to make and promulgate the following Ordinance:—

- 1. Short title.—This Ordinance may be called the Bangladesh Legal Practitioners and Bar Council (Amendment) Ordinance, 1975.
- 2. Substitution of Article 6, P.O. No. 46 of 1972.—In the Bangladesh Legal Practitioners and Bar Council Order, 1972 (P.O. No. 46 of 1972), hereinafter referred to as the said Order, for Article 6 the following shall be substituted, namely:—
- "6. (1) There shall be a Chairman and a Vice-Chairman of the Bar Council.
- (2) The Attorney-General for Bangladesh shall be the Chairman ex-officio of the Bar Council.
- (3) The Vice-Chairman of the Bar Council shall be elected in the prescribed manner by the members of the Council from amongst themselves.
- (4) The Chairman and the Vice-Chairman of the Bar Council shall have such powers and functions as may be prescribed.".

- 3. Amendment of Article 12, P.O. No. 46 of 1972.—In the said Order, in Article 12, in clause (b), the words "Chairman or" shall be omitted.
- 4. Amendment of Article 40, P.O. No. 46 of 1972.—In the said Order, in Article 40, in clause (2),—
 - (a) in sub-clause (b), the words "Chairman and" shall be omitted; and
 - (b) in sub-clause (c), the words "Chairman or" shall be omitted;".
