No. S.R.O. 130-L/84/ED(R-II)R-70/80.—In pursuance of the Proclamation of the 24th March, 1982, and in exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf, the President, after consultations with the Bangladesh Public Service Commission, is pleased to make the following amendment in the Bangladesh Civil Service Recruitment Rules, 1981, namely:—

No. S.R.O. 132-L/84/WE/R-1/80.—In pursuance of the Proclamation of the 24th March, 1982, and in exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf, the President, after consultation with the Bangladesh Public Service Commission, is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

THE DEPARTMENT OF SHIPPING (NON-GAZETTED EMPLOYEES OF THE OFFICES OF ENGINEER AND SHIP SURVEYOR INLAND SHIPS) RECRUITMENT RULES, 1983.

1. **Short title.**—These rules may be called the Department of Shipping (Non-Gazetted Employees of the Offices of Engineer and Ship Surveyor, Inland Ships) Recruitment Rules, 1983.

2. **Definitions.**—In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires:—

- (a) “appointing authority” means the Government and includes, in relation to any specified post or class of such posts, any officer authorised, by Government to make appointment to such post or class of post;
- (b) “Commission” means the Bangladesh Public Service Commission;
- (c) “Probationer” means a person appointed on probation to a specified post;
- (d) “requisite qualification” in relation to a specified post, means the qualification laid down in the Schedule in relation to that post;
- (e) “Schedule” means the schedule annexed to these rules; and
- (f) “Specified post” means a post specified in the Schedule;

3. **Procedure for recruitment.**—(1) Subject to the provisions of Schedule, appointment to a specified post shall be made:—

- (a) by direct recruitment; or
- (b) by promotion.

(2) No person shall be appointed to a specified post unless he has the requisite qualification and, in the case of direct recruitment he is also within the age-limit specified in the Schedule for that post;

4. **Appointment by direct recruitment.**—(1) No appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made except upon the recommendation of the Commission.

(2) No person shall be eligible for appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment, if he—

- (a) is not a citizen of Bangladesh or a permanent resident, or domiciled in, Bangladesh;
- (b) is married to, or has entered into a promise of marriage with, a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.

(3) No appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made until:—

- (a) the person selected for appointment is certified by an authorised Medical Officer appointed for the purpose by the Director General of Health Services to be medically fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer from any organic defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the specified post; and
- (b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment in the service of the Republic.

(4) No person shall be recommended for appointment to a specified post, unless—

- (a) he applied in such form, accompanied by such fee and before such date, as was notified by the Commission while inviting applications for the post; and
- (b) in the case of a person already in Government service or in the service of a local authority, he has applied through his official superiors.

5. **Appointment by promotion.**—(1) Appointment by promotion to specified post shall be made on the recommendation of such Departmental Promotion Committee as the Government may constitute in this behalf.

(2) A person shall not be eligible for appointment by promotion to a specified post if he has unsatisfactory records of service.

6. **Probation:**—(1) Persons selected for appointment to a specified post against a substantive vacancy shall be appointed on probation—

- (a) In the case of direct recruitment, for a period of two years from the date of substantive appointment; and
- (b) in the case of promotion, for a period of one year from the date of such appointment:

Provided that the appointing authority may, for reasons to be recorded in writing, extend the period of probation by a period or periods so that the extended period does not exceed two years in the aggregate.

(2) Where, during the period of probation of a probationer, the appointing authority is of opinion that his conduct and work is unsatisfactory or that he is not likely to become efficient, it may, before the expiry of that period:—

- (a) in the case of direct recruitment, terminate his service; and
- (b) in the case of promotion, revert him to the post from which he was promoted.

(3) After the completion of the period of probation including the extended period, if any, the appointing authority:—

- (a) If it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during his period of probation has been satisfactory, shall subject to the provisions of sub-rule (4), confirm him; and
- (b) if it is of opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during that period was not satisfactory, may,—
 - (i) in the case of direct recruitment, terminate his service; and
 - (ii) in the case of promotion revert him to the post from which he was promoted.

Explanation.—The period of probation of a probationer shall be deemed to have been extended if no order under this sub-rule has been made.

(4) A probationer shall not be confirmed in a specified post until he has passed such examination and undergone such training as the Government may, from time to time, direct by order.

GALEK HOSSAIN *alias* GALEF HOSSAIN

Whereas it has been made to appear to me that the accused Galek Hossain *alias* Galef Hossain, son of Abdus Sattar of Mulatole, P.S. Kotwali, Dist. Rangpur, is required for the purpose of trial in Summary Martial Law Court No. 10, Rangpur-Dinajpur;

And whereas the court has reason to believe that the said accused Galek Hossain in the case abovementioned is absconding or concealing himself to avoid appearance or arrest for the said purpose;

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by Regulation 2(11) of the Martial Law Regulation No. 1 of 1982, this Summary Martial Law Court No. 10, Rangpur-Dinajpur, do hereby direct the aforesaid accused person to appear in this court at 10 a.m. by 2nd June 1984 in Case No. MLTR 30/84, failing which he will be tried *in absentia* and his properties, both movable and immovable, may be forfeited to the Government.
