No. S.R.O. 248-L/78.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 133 of the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, the President, after consultation with the Bangladesh Public Service Commission as required by clause (2) of article 140 of that Constitution, has decided to make the following rules, namely:—

THE RESEARCH OFFICER AND STATISTICIAN RECRUITMENT
RULES, 1978.

1. **Short title.**—These rules may be called the Research Officer and Statistician Recruitment Rules, 1978.
2. **Definition.**—In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 - (a) "appointing authority" means the Government and includes, in relation to a specified post, any officer authorised by the Government to make appointment to such post;
 - (b) "Commission" means the Bangladesh Public Service Commission;
 - (c) "Probationer" means a person appointed on Probation to a specified post;
 - (d) "Requisite qualification" in relation to a specified post, means the qualification specified in the Schedule in relation to the post;
 - (e) "Schedule" means the Schedule annexed to these rules; and
 - (f) "Specified post" means a post specified in the Schedule.

3. **Procedure for recruitment.**—(i) Subject to the provisions of the Schedule, appointment to a specified post shall be made—

(a) by direct recruitment; or

(b) by promotion from amongst persons already holding specified posts.

(ii) No person shall be appointed to a specified post unless he has the requisite qualification, and in the case of direct recruitment, he is within the age limit, if any, specified in the Schedule for that post.

4. **Appointment by direct recruitment.**—(i) No appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made except upon the recommendation of the Commission.

(ii) No person shall be eligible for appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment—

(a) is not a citizen of Bangladesh, or a permanent resident of, or domiciled in Bangladesh;

(b) is not a person who has not entered into a promise of marriage with a person who is a citizen of Bangladesh.

(iii) No person shall be appointed to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made unless—

(a) his appointment is certified by a Medical Board constituted by the Director of Health Services to be medically fit and that he does not suffer from any physical defect which would interfere with the discharge of the duties of the post;

(b) the appointment of a person so selected have been verified through appropriate channels and to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment to the service of the Republic.

(iv) No persons shall be recommended by the Commission for appointment to a specified post, unless—

(a) he applied in such form, accompanied by such fee and before such date, as was notified by the Commission while inviting applications for the post; and

(b) in the case of a person already in Government service or in the service in a local authority or a statutory Corporation, he has applied through his official superior.

5. **Appointment by promotion.**—(i) Appointment by promotion to a specified post shall be made by the appointing authority after considering the recommendation of such Departmental promotion committee as the Government may set up for the purpose and in consultation with the Commission.

(ii) A person shall not be eligible for appointment by promotion to a specified post if he has not been confirmed in any post on the ground of unsatisfactory service records or of his failure to fulfil any other requirements for confirmation in that post.

6. Probation.—(i) Persons selected for appointment to a specified post against a substantive vacancy shall be appointed on probation—

- (a) in the case of direct recruitment, for a period of two years from the date of substantive appointment; and
- (b) in the case of promotion, for a period of one year from the date of such appointment:

Provided that the appointing authority may, for reasons to be recorded in writing extend the period of probation by a period or periods so that the extended period does not exceed two years in aggregate.

(ii) After the completion of the period of probation, the appointing authority,—

- (a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during the period of probation has been satisfactory, shall confirm him, and
- (b) if it is of opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during the period was not satisfactory, may, in the case of direct recruitment, terminate his service and, in the case of promotion, revert him to the post which he was promoted.
