NOTIFICATION

Dacca, the 19th September, 1979.

No. S.R.O. 253-L/79.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to article 133 of the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, the President, after consultation with the Bangladesh Public Service Commission as required by clause (2) of article 140 of that Constitution, is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

THE BENGALI AND ENGLISH REPORTERS (SPECIAL BRANCH)
RECRUITMENT RULES, 1979.

1. **Short title.**—These rules may be called the Bengali and English Reporters (Special Branch) Recruitment Rules, 1979.

2. **Definition.**—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—

- (a) "appointing authority" means the Government and includes, in relation to any specified post or class of such posts, any officer authorised by the Government to make appointment to such post or class of posts;
- (b) "Commission" means the Bangladesh Public Service Commission;
- (c) "Probationer" means a person appointed on probation to a specified post;

- (d) "recognised University" means a University established by or under any law for the time being in force and includes any other University declared by the Government after consultation with the Commission to be a recognised University for the purpose of these rules;
- (e) "requisite qualification" in relation to a specified post, means the qualification laid down in the Schedule in relation to that post;
- (f) "Schedule" means the Schedule annexed to these rules: and
- (g) "Specified post" means a post specified in the Schedule.

3. **Procedure for recruitment.**—(1) Subject to the provisions of the Schedule and instructions relating to reservation for the purpose of clause (3) of article 29 of the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, appointment to a specified post shall be made by direct recruitment.

(2) No person shall be appointed to a specified post unless he has the requisite qualification and within the age limit specified in the Schedule.

4. **Mode of appointment.**—(1) No appointment to a specified post shall be made except upon the recommendation of the Commission.

(2) No person shall be eligible for appointment to a specified post if he—

- (a) is not a citizen of Bangladesh.
- (b) is married to, or has entered into a promise of marriage with, a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.

(3) No appointment to a specified post shall be made until—

- (a) the person selected for appointment is certified by a Medical Board set up for the purpose by the Director of Health Services to be medically fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer from any such organic defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the specified post; and
- (b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment in the service of the Republic.

(4) No persons shall be recommended for appointment to a specified post unless—

- (a) he applied in such form, accompanied by such fee and before such date, as was notified by the Commission while inviting applications for the specified post; and
- (b) in the case of a person already in Government service or in the service of a local authority, he applied through his official superior.

5. **Probation.**—(1) Persons selected for appointment to a specified post against a permanent vacancy shall be appointed on probation, for a period of two years from the date of substantive appointment, provided that the appointing authority may, for reasons to be recorded in writing, extend the period of probation by a period or periods so that the extended period does not exceed two years in the aggregate.

(2) Where, during the period of probation of a probationer, the appointing authority is of opinion that his conduct and work is unsatisfactory or that he is not likely to become efficient, it may, before the expiry of that period, terminate his service.

(3) After the completion of the period of probation including the extended period, if any, the appointing authority,—

- (a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during his period of probation has been satisfactory, shall, subject to the provisions of sub-rule (4), confirm him; and
- (b) if it is of opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during that period was not satisfactory, may, terminate his service.
- (4) A probationer shall not be confirmed in a specified post until he has passed such examination and undergone such training as the Government may, from time to time, direct.

A dictation will be given for 3½ (three and half) minutes at a speed of 120 W.P.M. in English to be transcribed in handwriting in 40 minutes. 5 minutes shall be allowed to candidates for going through their shorthand notes after dictation and before they begin to transcribe. A margin of not more than 5% mistakes in English will be allowed.
