এস,আর, ও নং ২৭১-আইন/৯১/এমভিআরটি/১আর-১/৯০(অংশ-২)—Motor Vehicles Ordinance, 1983 (LV of 1983) এর section 35(3) এ প্রদত্ত ক্ষমতাবলে সরকারি Motor Vehicles Rules, 19৬4 তে নিম্নরূপ অধিকতর সংশোধন করিলেন, যাহার প্রাক-প্রকাশনা উক্ত Ordinance এর section 173(1) এর বিধান মোতাবেক ইতিপূর্বে সম্পন্ন হইয়াছে, যথা:—

উপরি-উক্ত Rules এর rule 62 এর পরিবর্তে নিম্নরূপ rule 62 প্রতিস্থাপিত হইবে, যথা:—

“62. Procedure of registration of vehicles of diplomatic Officers etc.—(1) Any motor vehicle which is the property or for the time being under the exclusive control of—

- (a) a diplomatic, consular or trade mission accredited to the Government of Bangladesh or of any member thereof;
- (b) the United Nations or any of its agencies;
- (c) any other person enjoying diplomatic privileges and status;

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- (d) the International Red Cross or any aid mission, International relief agency or any expert or official coming under any agreement with the Government ;

and has been imported free of duty shall be registered only by the special registering authority under sub-rule (2) and shall carry a special registration mark assigned to it.

(2) The special registering authority for the purpose of subsection (1) of section 35 of the Ordinance and of these rules shall be,—

- (a) in respect of motor vehicles mentioned in clauses (a), (b) and (c) of sub-rule (1), the Chief of Protocol in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs or any other officer authorised in this behalf by that Ministry ;
- (b) in respect of motor vehicles mentioned in clause (d) of sub-rule (1), the Bangladesh Road Transport Authority.

(3) An application by or on behalf of the owner of vehicle for special registration shall be in Form H as set forth in the First Schedule to the Ordinance, and shall contain the information required by that form.

(4) The special registering authority shall make such enquiries as it may deem necessary and if satisfied shall issue the owner thereof a certificate of registration in Form 'I' as set forth in the First Schedule to the Ordinance and shall enter in a record to be kept by it the particulars of such certificate.

(5) The special registering authority mentioned in clause (a) of sub-rule (2) shall assign in the manner hereinafter specified a registration mark to a vehicle registered by it for display thereon—

- (a) the mark shall contain two items, each item being separated by a hyphen or sufficient blank space ;
- (b) the first item shall consist of group of letters not exceeding three, the first letter shall indicate the status of the person, such as, diplomat or non-diplomat or official and the other two letters, to be fixed by the special registering authority, shall be the code for the country or organisation to which such diplomat or non-diplomat or official or privileged person of UN agencies belongs :

Provided that in the case of vehicle which is the property or for the time being under the exclusive control of the United Nations or any of its agencies, the second letter of the first item, shall be 'U'

(c) the first letter of the first item referred to in clause (b) shall be—

- (i) the letter 'দ' in case of a vehicle which is the property or for the time being under the exclusive control of a person enjoying diplomatic privileges and status or belongs to a diplomatic mission; and
- (ii) the letter 'অ' in the case of a vehicle which is the property or for the time being under the exclusive control of a member of a foreign mission or the United Nations or any of its agencies referred to in clauses (a) and (b) of sub-rule (1);

(d) the second item shall be the serial number of the vehicle in respective series consisting of not more than three digits such as 001 or 999.

(6) The special registering authority specified under clause (b) of sub-rule (2) shall assign in the manner hereinafter specified, a registration mark to a vehicle registered by it for display thereon—

- (a) the mark shall contain two items, each item being separated by a hyphen or sufficient blank space;
- (b) the first item shall consist of group of letters not exceeding three, the first letter shall indicate the name of the special registering authority and the other two letters, to be fixed by the special registering authority, shall be the code for the country or organisation to which such vehicle belongs; and
- (c) the second item shall be the serial number of the vehicle in respective series consisting of not more than three digits such as 001 or 999.

(7) The special registration marks shall be exhibited on a plate with yellow ground, the letters and the numerals shall be in black in a horizontal line written in the manner specified in sub-rule (5) or (6), as the case may be, and the size of the letters and numerals shall be maintained, as far as practicable, according to the size as may be specified by the special registering authority concerned for different types of vehicles:

Provided that in a case where it is considered necessary, the Government may, by order, require the exhibition of registration mark on a plate of the colour to be specified by it.

(8) While issuing the certificate of registration, the special registering authority shall ask the diplomatic, consular or trade mission or any member thereof, United Nations, International Red Cross, aid mission, experts, officials and International relief agencies coming under any agreement with the Government owning the vehicle to get it physically

verified and to get a certificate of such verification recorded in the certificate of registration within one month from the date of issue of the certificate of registration by any Inspector of Motor Vehicles.

(9) The special registering authority may charge such registration fee as may be notified by the Government from time to time and such fee for the supply of the number plate to the owner of the vehicle as may be notified by the Government.

(10) When a motor vehicle carrying special registration marks is transferred or sold or does no longer remain the property of the diplomatic, consular or trade mission or any member thereof, United Nations, experts, officials and International relief agencies coming under any agreement with the Government it shall cease to display special registration marks and shall surrender the certificate of registration to the special registering authority.

(11) The special registering authority or any other officer authorised by the Government in this behalf, may suspend or cancel the special registration for reasons to be recorded in writing.

(12) When the special registration is suspended or cancelled in accordance with the preceding sub-rule (11), an appeal may be preferred within thirty days of the order to the Secretary, Roads and Road Transport Division.

(13) The motor vehicles registered before the commencement of these rules shall be assigned new registration marks in accordance with these rules within three months from the date of the commencement of these rules.

(14) The previous certificate of registration shall be surrendered and shall be cancelled by the special registering authority which issued it."]

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
