## NOTIFICATIONS

Dacca, the 16th August 1982.

**No. S.R.O. 288-L/82/PE/4R-1882.**—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 35 of the Ports Act, 1908 (XV of 1908), the Government is pleased to make the following amendment in its Notification No. S.R.O. 213-L/82/PE/4R-18/82, dated the 19th June, 1982, namely:—

In the aforesaid Notification, for Note I, the following shall be *substituted*, namely:—

*“Note I.—Rates of pilotage fees in dollar as appearing in this Notification shall mean U.S. Dollar. Payment for pilotage fees and night navigation fees shall be received in Bangladesh Taka calculated at the official rate of exchange (selling) on the date of arrival of the vessel at the Chittagong Port and, in the event the arrival date of the vessel coincides with Sunday or any holiday, and for that reason the official rate of exchange is not available, the prevailing rate of exchange on the preceding date shall be taken into consideration for assessment of pilotage fees and night navigation fees”.*

**No. S.R.O. 289-L/82/PE/4R-18/82.**—In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (2) of section 33 of the Ports Act, 1908 (XV of 1908), the Government is pleased to make the following further alteration in the First Schedule to the said Act, namely:—

In the aforesaid Schedule, in Part V, in the entries relating to the Port of Chittagong, for Note I, the following shall be *substituted*, namely:—

*“Note I.—Rates and dues in dollar as appearing in this Schedule shall mean U.S. Dollar. Payment for port dues shall be received in Bangladesh Taka calculated at the official rate of exchange (selling) on the date of arrival of the vessel at the Chittagong Port and, in the event the arrival date of the vessel coincides with Sunday or any holiday, and for that reason official rate of exchange is not available, the prevailing rate of exchange on the preceding date shall be taken into consideration for assessment of port dues”.*
