**MINISTRY OF PUBLIC WORKS AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT**

**Section I**

**NOTIFICATION**

**Dacca, the 17th November 1979.**

No. S.R.O. 320-L/79.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the provision to article 133 of the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, the President, after consultation with the Bangladesh Public Service Commission, as

required by clause (2) of article 140 of that Constitution, is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

**THE JOINT COMPTROLLER AND ASSISTANT COMPTROLLER (REST HOUSE ORGANISATION) RECRUITMENT RULES, 1979.**

1. **Short title.**—These rules, may be called the Joint Comptroller and Assistant Comptroller (Rest House Organisation) Recruitment Rules, 1979.

2. **Definitions.**—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—

(a) “Appointing authority” means the Government and includes in relation to any specified post, any officer authorised by Government to make appointment to such posts;

(b) “Commission” means the Bangladesh Public Service Commission;

(c) “Organisation” means the Rest House Organisation under the Ministry of Public Works and Urban Development;

(d) “Probationer” means a person appointed on probation to a specified post;

(e) “Recognised University” means a University established by or under any law for the time being in force and includes any other University declared by the Government, after consultation with the Bangladesh Public Service Commission, to be a recognised University for the purpose of these rules;

(f) “Requisite qualification” in relation to a specified post means the qualification laid down in the schedule in relation to the post;

(g) “Schedule” means the schedule annexed to these rules;

(h) “Specified post” means a post specified in the schedule.

3. **Procedure for recruitment.**—(1) Subject to the provisions of the schedule and instructions relating to reservation for the purpose of clause (3) of article 29 of the Constitution of the People’s Republic of Bangladesh, appointment to a specified post shall be made by the appointing authority—

(a) by direct recruitment; or

(b) by promotion.

(2) No person shall be appointed to a specified post unless he has the requisite qualification and in the case of direct recruitment, he is also within the age limit laid down in the schedule for the post:

Provided that, the upper limit for age may be relaxed in the case of a person who has already been appointed to a specified post on *ad hoc* basis by such period as he may have been holding the post continuously as an *ad hoc* appointee.

4. **Appointment by direct recruitment.**—(1) No appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made except upon the recommendation of the Commission.

(2) No person shall be eligible for appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment, if he—

(a) is not a citizen of, or a permanent resident of Bangladesh:

Provided that this clause shall not apply in the case of a person who is already in the service of the Republic;

(b) is married to, or has entered into a promise of marriage with, a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.

(3) No appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made, until—

(a) the person selected for appointment is certified by an authorised medical officer or by a medical board set-up for the purpose by the Director of Health Services to be medically fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer any such organic defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the specified post; and

(b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment in the service of the Republic.

(4) No person shall be recommended for appointment to a specified post, unless—

(a) he applied in such form, accompanied by such fee and before such date, as was notified by the Commission while inviting applications for the specified post; and

(b) in the case of a person already in Government service or in the service of a local authority, he applied through his official superiors.

**5. Appointment by promotion.**—(1) Appointment by promotion to a specified post shall be made on the recommendation of such departmental promotion committee set up for this purpose by the Government:

Provided that appointment by promotion to a specified post of higher class shall be made on the recommendation of the Commission.

(2) A person shall not be eligible for appointment by promotion to a specified post if he has unsatisfactory record of service.

**6. Probation.**—(1) Person selected for appointment to a specified post against substantive vacancy shall be appointed on probation—

(a) in the case of direct recruitment, for a period of two years from the date of substantive appointment; and

(b) in the case of promotion, for a period of one year from the date of such appointment:

Provided that the appointing authority may for reasons to be recorded in writing, extend the period of probation by a period or periods so that the extended period does not exceed two years in the aggregate.

(2) Where, during the period of probation of a probationer the appointing authority is of the opinion that his conduct and work is unsatisfactory or that he is not likely to become efficient if any, before the expiry of that period—

(a) in the case of direct recruitment, terminate his service;

(b) in the case of promotion, revert him to the post from which he was promoted.

(3) After the completion of the period of probation including the extended period, if any, the appointing authority—

(a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during the period of probation has been satisfactory shall, subject to the provisions of sub-rule (4), confirm him; and

(b) if it is of the opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during the period was not satisfactory, may—

(i) in the case of direct recruitment, terminate his service; and

(ii) in the case of promotion, revert him to the post from which he was promoted.

(4) A probationer shall not be confirmed to a specified post until he has passed such examination and undergone such training as the Government may, from time to time, direct.
