**MINISTRY OF PORTS, SHIPPING AND INLAND WATER TRANSPORT**  
**NOTIFICATION**

**Dacca, the 20th December, 1978.**

**No. S.R.O. 340-L/78.**—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Article 133 of the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, the President, after consultation with the Bangladesh Public Service Commission as required by clause (2) of Article 140 of that Constitution, is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

**THE CLASS I GAZETTED OFFICERS (MINISTRY OF PORTS, SHIPPING  
AND INLAND WATER TRANSPORT) (PLANNING CELL)  
RECRUITMENT RULES, 1978.**

1. **Short title.**—These rules may be called the Class I Gazetted Officers (Ministry of Ports, Shipping and Inland Water Transport) (Planning Cell) Recruitment Rules, 1978.

2. **Definitions.**—In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires,—

- (a) "appointing authority" means the Government and includes, in relation to any specified post or class of such posts, any officer authorised by Government to make appointment to such post or class of posts;
- (b) "Commission" means the Bangladesh Public Service Commission;
- (c) "experience" means, unless otherwise provided in these rules, experience in any Class I post in the service of the Republic or in any equivalent post in local authority or research or training in the allied field and subject or in both;
- (d) "probationer" means a person appointed on probation to a specified post;
- (e) "recognised University" means a University established by or under any law for the time being in force and includes any other University declared by Government, after consultation with the Commission, to be a recognised University for the purposes of these rules;

- (f) "requisite qualification", in relation to a specified post, means the qualification prescribed in the Schedule in relation to that post;
- (g) "Schedule" means the Schedule annexed to these rules; and
- (h) "specified post" means a post specified in the Schedule.

3. **Procedure for recruitment.**—(1) Subject to the provisions of the Schedule and instructions relating to reservation for the purposes of clause (3) of Article 29 of the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, appointment to a specified post shall be made—

- (a) by direct recruitment; or
- (b) by promotion.

(2) No person shall be appointed to a specified post unless he has the requisite qualification and, in the case of direct recruitment, he is also within the age limit, if any, prescribed in the Schedule for that post.

4. **Appointment by direct recruitment.**—(1) No appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made except upon the recommendation of the Commission.

(2) No person shall be eligible for appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment, if he—

- (a) is not a citizen of Bangladesh or a permanent resident of, or domiciled in, Bangladesh; and
- (b) is married to a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.

(3) No appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made until—

- (a) the person selected for appointment is certified by a Medical Board set up for the purpose by the Director of Health Services to be medically fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer from any such organic defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the post; and
- (b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment in the service of the Republic.

(4) No person shall be recommended for appointment to a specified post unless—

- (a) he applied in such form, accompanied by such fee and before such date, as was notified by the Commission while inviting applications for the post; and
- (b) in the case of a person already in Government service or in the service of a local authority, he has applied through his official superior.

5. **Appointment by promotion.**—(1) Appointment by promotion to the post of Deputy Chief and Chief shall be made after considering the recommendation of such Departmental Selection Board as the Government may constitute in this behalf or the Superior Selection Board, as the case may be.

(2) A person shall not be eligible for appointment by promotion to a specified post if he has not been confirmed in any post on the ground of unsatisfactory service records or of his failure to fulfil any other requirement for confirmation in that post.

6. **Probation.**—(1) Persons selected for appointment to a specified post against a substantive vacancy shall be appointed on probation,—

- (a) in the case of direct recruitment, for a period of two years from the date of substantive appointment; and
- (b) in the case of promotion, for a period of one year from the date of such appointment:

Provided that the appointing authority may, for reasons to be recorded in writing, extend the period of probation in the case of any person by a period or periods so that the extended period does not exceed two years in the aggregate.

(2) Where, during the period of probation of a probationer, the appointing authority is of opinion that his conduct and work is unsatisfactory or that he is not likely to become efficient, it may, before the expiry of that period—

- (a) in the case of direct recruitment, terminate the service of the probationer; and
- (b) in the case of promotion, revert him to the post from which he was promoted.

(3) After the completion of the period of probation the appointing authority,—

- (a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during his period of probation has been satisfactory, shall, subject to the provisions of sub-rule (4), confirm him; and
- (b) if it is of opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during that period was not satisfactory, may,—
  - (i) in the case of direct recruitment, terminate his service; and
  - (ii) in the case of promotion, revert him to the post from which he was promoted.

*Explanation.*—The period of probation of a probationer shall be deemed to have been extended if no order under this sub-rule has been made.

(4) A probationer shall not be confirmed in a specified post until he has passed such examination and training as the Government may, from time to time, direct.

First Class Master's Degree in Economics or Business Administration or Statistics or Bachelor's Degree in Engineering from any recognised University with 14 years' experience in the subject or field of which at least 10 years' in the field of Planning and Development of Maritime Ports, Shipping and Inland Water Transport. Adequate experience as Head of a Government office will be given preference.

Whereas it has been made to appear to the Court that accused Minoti Rani Sarkar, wife of Sree Profullaya Kumar Sarkar of 40-E, Upendra Chandra Banerjee Road, Calcutta—54 (India), is required for the purpose of trial in the Summary Martial Law Court, Kushtia, u/s 19, MLR, in connection with the abovenoted G.R. Case in Poradah GRPS Case No. 4, dated 26th March 1978;

And whereas this Court has reason to believe that the said accused person is absconding or concealing herself to avoid appearance or arrest for the said purpose;

Now, therefore, in exercise of powers conferred upon me by MLR No. 3(7)/76, I do hereby direct the said accused person to appear in this Court to be seated at Chuadanga on or before 28th December 1978, failing which she will be tried *in absentia* and her properties may be forfeited to the Government.
