No. S.R.O. 387-L/84/1Pro-58/80/D.IX.—In pursuance of the Proclamation of the 24th March, 1982 and in exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf, the President is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

THE OFFICERS (MILITARY LANDS AND CANTONMENTS DIRECTORATE) RECRUITMENT RULES, 1984

1. **Short title.**—These rules may be called the Officers (Military Lands and Cantonments Directorate) Recruitment Rules, 1984.

2. **Definitions.**—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—

- (a) “appointing authority” means the Government and includes, in relation to a specified post or class of such posts, an Officer authorised by the Government to make appointment to such post or class of posts;
- (b) “Departmental Selection Committee” means a body constituted of the Joint Secretary (General), Ministry of Defence, the Director, Military Lands and Cantonments Directorate and the Deputy Director, Military Lands and Cantonments Directorate;

- (c) "Departmental Promotion Committee" means a body constituted of the Director, Military Lands and Cantonments Directorate, the Deputy Director, Military Lands and Cantonments Directorate and Military Estate Officer, Central Circle, Dhaka;
- (d) "probationer" means a person appointed on probation to a specified post;
- (e) "recognised university" means a university established by or under any law for the time being in force and includes any other university declared by the Government to be a recognised university for the purposes of these rules;
- (f) "requisite qualification", in relation to a specified post, means the qualification laid down in the Schedule in relation to the post;
- (g) "Schedule" means the Schedule annexed to these rules; and
- (h) "specified post" means a post specified in the Schedule.

3. **Procedure for recruitment.**—(1) Subject to the provisions of the Schedule, appointment to a specified post shall be made—

- (a) by direct recruitment;
- (b) by promotion; or
- (c) by transfer on deputation.

(2) No person shall be appointed to a specified post unless he has the requisite qualification, and in the case of direct recruitment, he is also within the age limit laid down in the Schedule for that post:

Provided that the age limit, in the case of a person who has already been appointed to a specified post on *ad hoc* basis, may be relaxed by such period as he may have been holding that post continuously as an *ad hoc* appointee.

4. **Appointment by direct recruitment.**—(1) No appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made except upon the recommendation of the Departmental Selection Committee.

(2) No person shall be eligible for appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment, if he—

- (a) is not a citizen or a permanent resident of Bangladesh; or
- (b) is married to, or has entered into a promise of marriage with, a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.

(3) No appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment shall be made until—

- (a) the person selected for appointment is certified by an authorised Medical Officer that he is medically fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer from any such organic defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the post; and
- (b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment in the service of the Republic.

(4) No person shall be recommended for appointment to a specified post by direct recruitment unless—

- (a) he applied in such form accompanied by such fee and before such date as was notified by the Departmental Selection Committee while inviting applications for that post; and
- (b) in the case of a person already in Government service or in the service of a local authority, he applied through his official superior.

5. Appointment by promotion.—(1) Appointment by promotion to a specified post shall be made on the recommendation of the Departmental Promotion Committee.

(2) A person shall not be eligible for appointment by promotion to a specified post if he has unsatisfactory records of service.

6. Probation.—(1) Persons selected for appointment to a specified post, otherwise than by transfer on deputation, against a substantive vacancy shall be appointed on probation,—

- (a) in the case of direct recruitment, for a period of two years from the date of substantive appointment; and
- (b) in the case of promotion, for a period of one year from the date of such appointment;

Provided that the appointing authority may, for reasons to be recorded in writing, extend the period of probation by a period or periods so that the extended period does not exceed two years in the aggregate.

(2) Where, during the period of probation of a probationer, the appointing authority is of opinion that his conduct and work is unsatisfactory and that he is not likely to become efficient, it may, before that period,—

- (a) in the case of direct recruitment, terminate his service; and
- (b) in the case of probation, revert him to the post from which he was promoted.

(3) After the completion of the period of probation including the extended period, if any, the appointing authority,—

- (a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during his period of probation has been satisfactory, shall, subject to the provisions of sub-rule (4), confirm him; and
- (b) if it is of opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during that period was not satisfactory, may,—
 - (i) in the case of direct recruitment, terminate his service; and
 - (ii) in the case of promotion, revert him to the post from which he was promoted.

Explanation.—The period of probation of a probationer, shall be deemed to have been extended if no order under this sub-rule has been made.

(4) A probationer shall not be confirmed in a specified post until he has passed such examination and undergone such training as the Government may, from time to time, prescribe by order.
