Dhaka, the 29th November 1982

**No. 401-L/82.**—In pursuance of the Proclamation of the 24th March, 1982, and in exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf, the Chief Martial Law Administrator is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

1. **Short title.**—These rules may be called the Wireless and Telephone Operators (Ministry of Foreign Affairs) Recruitment Rules, 1982.

2. **Definitions.**—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—

- (a) "appointing authority" means the Government and includes, in relation to any specified post or class of such posts, any officer authorised by the Government to make appointment to such post or class of posts;
- (b) "Commission" means the Bangladesh Public Service Commission;
- (c) "probationer" means a person appointed on probation to a specified post;
- (d) "requisite qualification", in relation to a specified post, means the qualification laid down in the Schedule in relation to that post;
- (e) "Schedule" means the Schedule annexed to these rules; and
- (f) "specified post" means a post specified in the Schedule.

3. **Procedure for recruitment.**—(1) Subject to the provisions of the Schedule, appointment to a specified post shall be made by direct recruitment.

(2) No person shall be appointed to a specified post unless he has the requisite qualification and is also within the age limit laid down in the Schedule for that post.

4. **Appointment.**—(1) No appointment to a specified post shall be made except upon the recommendation of the Commission.

(2) No person shall be eligible for appointment to a specified post, if he—

(a) is not a citizen of Bangladesh, or a permanent resident of, or domiciled in, Bangladesh:

Provided that this clause shall not apply in the case of a person who is already in the service of the Republic;

(b) is married to, or has entered into a promise of marriage with, a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.

(3) No appointment to a specified post shall be made until—

(a) the person selected for appointment is certified by a medical officer duly authorised by the Government in this behalf to be medically fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer from any such organic defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the specified post; and

(b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment in the service of the Republic.

(4) No person shall be recommended for appointment to a specified post unless—

(a) he applied in such form, accompanied by such fee and before such date, as was notified by the Commission while inviting applications for the specified post; and

(b) in the case of a person already in Government service or in the service of a local authority, he applied through his official superior.

5. **Probation.**—(1) Persons selected for appointment to a specified post against a substantive vacancy shall be appointed on probation for a period of two years from the date of substantive appointment:

Provided that the appointing authority may, for reasons to be recorded in writing, extend the period of probation by a period or periods so that the extended period does not exceed two years in the aggregate.

(2) Where, during the period of probation of a probationer, the appointing authority is of opinion that his conduct and work is unsatisfactory or that he is not likely to become efficient, it may, before the expiry of that period, terminate his service.

(3) After the completion of the period of probation including the extended period, if any, the appointing authority,—

- (a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during his period of probation has been satisfactory, shall, subject to the provisions of sub-rule (4), confirm him; and
- (b) if it is of opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during that period was not satisfactory, may terminate his service.

(4) A probationer shall not be confirmed in a specified post until he has passed such examination and undergone such training as the Government may, from time to time, direct:

EMPLOYMENT NOTICE

No. 502-JI/Con-2/82.—Applications in the prescribed form are invited from the nationals of Bangladesh for filling up on urgent basis 100 temporary posts of Munsif in the Bangladesh Civil Service (Judicial) Cadre on the basis of *viva-voce* test to be conducted by a Selection Board to be constituted in the Law and Parliamentary Affairs Division:

- (1) Pay .. Tk. 750—50—900—E.B.—55—1230—60—1470. If a candidate enrolled to the Bar is appointed to the post of a Munsif he would be given one advance increment.
- (2) Qualification .. A candidate must be a graduate in Law or Jurisprudence of any University recognised by the Government or Barrister-at-Law or an Advocate on the rolls of the High Court Division in Bangladesh.

- (3) Age limit ... A candidate must have attained the age of 21 years and must have not exceeded 35 years on 1st December, 1982. The only proof of age acceptable by the Law Division is the age or date of birth recorded in the certificate of Secondary School Certificate Examination or the certificate of equivalent examination.
- (4) Women are eligible to apply.
- (5) Nationality ... A candidate must be a citizen of Bangladesh and a permanent resident of Bangladesh or domiciled therein.
- (6) Selection procedure ... Selection of candidates will be made on the basis of *viva-voce* test by a Selection Board to be constituted in the Law and Parliamentary Affairs Division.
- (7) Application forms prescribed by this Division may be obtained from the office of the undersigned either personally or by sending a self-addressed large size envelope bearing Bangladesh postage stamps of Tk. 4.50 affixed to it or from the office of all the District Judges.
- (8) Closing date ... The last date for receipt of application is 22nd December, 1982. Applications together with requisite documents must reach the undersigned on or before the said date. Whatever may be the reason for delay, no application received after the last date shall be accepted by this Division.
- (9) Applications which are not supported by attested or photostat copies of certificates/provisional certificates of Board/University and other documentary evidence regarding age, educational qualification, etc., will not be entertained and no interview card will be issued in such cases.
- (10) Interview cards with the indication of date, time and place of the examination will be issued to the selected candidates in due course.
- (11) If a candidate wants to be sure about the reaching of his application to the undersigned, he should send his application by registered post with acknowledgement due.
