No. S. R. O. 516-L/84/Per-3/R4-6/83/730.—In pursuance of the Proclamation of the 24th March, 1982, and in exercise of all powers enabling him in that behalf, the President, after consultation with the Bangladesh Public Service Commission, is pleased to make the following rules, namely:—

**THE MEDICAL ASSISTANT RECRUITMENT RULES, 1984.**

1. **Short title and application.**—(1) These rules may be called the Medical Assistant Recruitment Rules, 1984.

They shall apply to the Medical Assistants of Health Wing as well as of Population Control Wing of the Ministry of Health and Population Control.

2. **Definitions.**—In these rules, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context,—

- (a) "appointing authority" means the Government and includes an officer authorised by the Government to make appointment to the post;
- (b) "Commission" means the Bangladesh Public Service Commission;
- (c) "probationer" means a person appointed on probation to the post;
- (d) "post" means the post of Medical Assistant.

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3. **Procedure for recruitment.**—(1) Appointment to the post shall be made by direct recruitment.

(2) No person shall be appointed to the post unless he—

- (a) has passed the Secondary School Certificate Examination from a Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education established by or under any law or any other Board recognised by the Government.
- (b) holds a Diploma from the Medical Assistant Training School registered with the State Medical Faculty of Bangladesh; and
- (c) is between 18 and 25 years, relaxable in the case of a departmental candidate.

4. **Appointment.**—(1) No appointment to the post shall be made except upon the recommendation of the Commission.

(2) No person shall be eligible for appointment to the post, if he—

- (a) is not a citizen of Bangladesh or a permanent resident of, or domiciled in, Bangladesh; or
- (b) is married to, or has entered into a promise of marriage with, a person who is not a citizen of Bangladesh.

(3) No appointment to the post shall be made until—

- (a) the person selected for appointment is certified by a Medical Officer authorised by the Director General of Health Services in this behalf to be medically fit for such appointment and that he does not suffer from any such organic defect as is likely to interfere with the discharge of the duties of the post; and
- (b) the antecedents of the person so selected have been verified through appropriate agencies and found to be such as do not render him unfit for appointment in the service of the Republic.

(4) No person shall be selected for appointment to the post unless—

- (a) he applied in such form, accompanied by such fee and before such date as was notified by the commission, as the case may be, by the appointing authority while inviting application for the post; and
- (b) in the case of a person already in Government service or in the service of a local authority, he applied through his official superior.

5. **Probation.**—(1) Persons selected for appointment to the post against a substantive vacancy shall be appointed on probation for a period of two years from the date of substantive appointment:

Provided that the appointing authority may, for reasons to be recorded in writing, extend the period of probation by a period or periods so that the extended period does not exceed two years in the aggregate.

(2) Where, during the period of probation of a probationer, the appointing authority is of opinion that his conduct and work is unsatisfactory and that he is not likely to become efficient, it may, before the expiry of that period, terminate his service.



(3) After the completion of the period of probation including the extended period, if any, the appointing authority,—

(a) if it is satisfied that the conduct and work of the probationer during his period of probation has been satisfactory, shall, subject to the provisions of sub-rule (4), confirm him; and

(b) if it is of opinion that the conduct and work of the probationer during that period was not satisfactory, may terminate his service.

(4) A probationer shall not be confirmed in the post until he has passed such examination and undergone such training as the Government may, from time to time, direct.

6. The Medical Assistant Recruitment Rules, 1981 published under S.R.O. No. 221-L/81, dated the 27th June 1981 is hereby *repealed*.
