THE CENSUS RULES, 1973

1. **Short title and commencement**—(1) These rules may be called the Census Rules, 1973.

- (f) "urban area" means areas declared by the Census Organisation as such.

3. **Census area and Census Officer under sub-clause (ii) of clause (1) of Article 4 of the Order**—(1) There shall be following field offices and officers therefor:

- (a) **Districts**—An officer of the General Administration of the District shall be designated as District Superintendent of Census who shall work for Census in addition to his own duties.
- (b) **Census Districts**—Each of the administrative Subdivision, and all Paurashavas (Municipalities) having more than one lakh population according to 1961 Census, shall be Census-Districts under the charge of a Census District officer.
- (c) **Census Charges**—Each Census District shall be divided into a number of Census-Charges comprising a Thana or part of a Thana or a Ward or part of a Ward in case of Paurashavas (Municipalities) under the Charge of a Charge Superintendent.
- (d) **Census Circles**—Each Census Charge shall be divided into a number of Census-Circles comprising a Union Panchayet or a part of it under the Charge of a Circle Supervisor.
- (e) **Blocks**—For each of the Census-Circle, there shall be a number of Blocks comprising a Village or a part of it in the rural areas and a portion of Ward in case of urban areas as decided by the Census Organisation under the charge of an Enumerator.

2. The powers of the Government under sub-clause (ii) of clause (1) of Article 4 of the Order shall also be exercisable, within their respective jurisdiction, by—

- (a) Census Commissioner;
- (b) Joint Census Commissioner;
- (c) Deputy Census Commissioner;
- (d) Assistant Census Commissioner;
- (e) Deputy Commissioner;
- (f) District Superintendent of Census;
- (g) Subdivisional Officer;
- (h) Census District Officer.

3. The officers mentioned in sub-rule (2) are authorised to sign declarations of the nature referred to in clause (2) of Article 4 of the Order.

4. **Authorised officers under Article 5 of the Order**—The following officers are authorised to exercise, within their respective jurisdiction, the power exercisable under Article 5 of the Order by the Deputy Commissioner, namely:—

- (a) Census Commissioner;
- (b) Joint Census Commissioner;

- (d) Assistant Census Commissioner;
- (e) Deputy Commissioner;
- (f) District Superintendent of Census;
- (g) Subdivisional Officer;
- (h) Census District Officer.

5. Authority to call upon certain persons to give assistance under Article 6 of the Order—Any Census Officer appointed under sub-clause (ii) of clause (1) of Article 4 of the Order may, by order in writing, call upon any of the categories of the persons mentioned in sub-clauses (a), (b), (c) and (d) of Article 6 of the Order to work as Enumerator, or perform any other duties of a Census Officer, or to give such assistance as may be specified in the order towards the taking of Census.

6. Census Schedule under Article 9 of the Order—The Schedule referred to in clause (1) of Article 9 of the order shall be in the form devised by the Census Organisation and published in the *Official Gazette*.

7. Authorised officer under Article 11 of the Order—The following officer is authorised within his jurisdictions, for the purpose of being consulted by the Paurashava (Municipality) or other local authority, under Article 11 of the Order, namely:—

(a) Deputy Commissioner.

8. Sanction for Prosecution under Article 14 of the Order—The following officers are authorised, within their respective jurisdictions, to exercise the powers to sanction prosecution under the Article 14 of the Order, namely:—

(a) Deputy Commissioner.

**THE BANGLADESH AGRICULTURAL DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION
(GRATUITY) REGULATIONS, 1973.**

1. **Short title and commencement**—(i) These Regulations shall be called the Bangladesh Agricultural Development Corporation (Gratuity) Regulations, 1973.

(ii) They shall come into force at once.

2. **Definitions**—In these Regulations, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context—

(a) "Corporation" means the Bangladesh Agricultural Development Corporation established under the East Pakistan Agricultural Development Corporation Ordinance, 1961 (East Pakistan Ordinance No. XXXVII of 1961).

(b) "Completed year" means 12 months' continuous service with the Corporation from the date of joining.

(c) "Employee" means regular salaried officer or staff of the Corporation other than the following:—

(i) A Government servant whose services have been lent to the Corporation.

(ii) Re-employed retired Government servants who enjoy pension benefit from the Government.

(iii) Servants of other organisations whose services have been lent to the Corporation.

(iv) Seasonal or contingent employees.

(v) Employees who are not Bangalee Nationals; Advisors, Consultants and employees on contract basis, either Foreign or Bangalees who are not regular employees of the Corporation.

(d) "Form" means forms appended to these Regulations.

(e) "Pay" means the monthly pay earned by an employee during a calendar month for a post held by him substantively to which he is entitled by reasons of his position and includes special pay, personal pay and technical pay.

(f) "Service" means continuous and whole time service with the Corporation and includes probationary period, period of authorised leave and period spent on authorised duty, courses of instruction or training in and outside Bangladesh.

3. **Extent of application**—These Regulations shall apply to all regular employees of the Corporation but will not apply to those employees who left the service of the Corporation before commencement of the Regulations.

4. **Eligibility**—Gratuity cannot be claimed as a matter of right but will be granted at the discretion of the Corporation to an employee on his ceasing to be in the Corporation's service, or in the event of his death before receipt of gratuity, to his nominee/legal heir(s) subject to the following conditions:

(i) He has rendered minimum 5 years of service with the Corporation which may be reduced on *ex-gratia* basis by the Corporation in the following cases—

(a) If an employee dies while in the services of the Corporation;

(b) If the services of the employee have been terminated or he has retired or has been required to retire, on account of certified permanent incapacity due to physical or mental infirmity or continuous ill health;

(c) If the services of an employee have been terminated or he has been required to retire owing to abolition of his post on account of reduction of establishment;

- (iv) The exporter makes a declaration on the reverse of the original shipping bill or other export documents to the effect that he would claim repayment of the customs duties paid on the imported raw materials used in the production of the goods being exported.
- (v) The repayment at the rate specified shall be allowed provided that the goods exported are manufactured with the same constituents on which the rate of repayment is notified and the manufacturer-cum-exporter shall immediately intimate to the National Board of Revenue and the Directorate of Inspection and Training, Customs and Excise, Dacca.
 - (a) any change in the prices of the imported raw materials,
 - (b) any changes in the composition of the manufactured goods to be exported, and
 - (c) use of any indigenous raw material in place of the imported raw materials.
